From Fr David

Chinese New Year

Dear friends,

It has been a full week for me. Last Sunday I drove to Trangie, some 100km west of Dubbo, for the funeral of a colleague's father. It was a remarkable experience of the drought that has gripped much of our State. Indeed on Sunday night I discovered myself in the midst of the huge dust storm that enveloped Dubbo. The trip made me even more conscious of the need our country faces, and in particular of the dire hardship faced by our farmers. I have thought to reconsider Pope Francis' letter on our responsibility for the environment, Laudato Si' (2015) and propose that we make available the opportunity to reflect and pray on this together, especially given the circumstances of this summer. Given that our Lenten period has already been committed to a prayerful consideration of the themes of the Plenary Council 2020, I propose that we make this opportunity to reflect on our stewardship of creation possible during our Season of Easter when our focus is on renewed hope.

As we prepare to enter our Season of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday on 26 February, and our prayerful engagement of the themes of the Plenary, we are privileged that **Dr Paul Collins, the eminent Australian Church historian, will join us on Monday 10 February for a public lecture on the Plenary.** Dr Collins will focus on the Plenary's emphasis on evangelisation in the practical context of secular Australia, and on the syndodal nature of Church governance in the New Testament and the first millennium of church history. It will be a very stimulating evening so do mark it in your diary!

Special wishes to all our teachers, students and families as they prepare for the return to a new school year. Last Friday it was my pleasure to celebrate Mass for the staff of Loreto College Normanhurst. On Tuesday morning at our 9.15am Mass we will be joined by our staff from Prouille and next Friday it will be my privilege to celebrate the Opening Mass for Brigidine College which will include the commissioning of the new Principal, Laetitia (Teash) Richmond. May this year be one of great blessing for all our school communities.



Congratulations to *Chris Le Gras* who celebrates his 90th Birthday on Saturday, 1st February! Lunar New Year is a Chinese festival that celebrates the beginning of a new year on the traditional Chinese Calendar.





The World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice. Our Parish Participation in the journey towards the Plenary Council of 2020-2021

Through the "Listening Phase" of the journey towards the Plenary Council which opens in October 2019, six themes emerged for consideration in the current "Discernment Phase." The six themes are about a Christ-centred Church which is

- Missionary and evangelising
- Inclusive, participatory and synodal
- Prayerful and Eucharistic
- Humble, healing and merciful
- A joyful, hope filled and servant community
- Open to conversion, renewal and reform You will see posters reflecting these themes on the wall of our church.



This year, we will take these themes and ask, "What might these mean for us a parish community?"

We propose to do this in several ways:

- **On Monday 10 February** we will host a community evening with Dr Paul Collins, historian and social commentator about the Plenary Council;
- **During Lent** we will invite our community to **pray** these themes. On each of the six Thursdays of Lent we will invite our parishioners to come together for a meal at Prouille followed by a guided prayer and faith reflection on each theme;
- In the second half of the year we will stage a facilitated process of six parish forums, each on a theme, discussing how the theme might be realised in our own context. The outcomes of the forums will be at the service of developing a 3 year strategic pastoral plan for our community.
