
On Tuesday last, I was invited by the Hon Paul Fletcher MP to join a group of religious leaders in the Federal Seat of Bradfield in discussion about the question of religious freedom in Australia. We were joined by Mr Philip Ruddock, whom the Turnbull Government has appointed as Chair of an eminent group of Australians to inquire into the question of religious freedom. Paul is to be congratulated for his initiative in this. Though the discussion was wide-ranging, it was clear that many people today are liable to experience a certain form of discrimination because of their religious convictions. This is a new development in our country where the religious voice has largely become marginalised in the public forum and in the debate on major social issues. At worst, it becomes associated, extraordinarily, with 'hate speech.' This labelling will present, possibly, as one challenge in the ongoing delivery of religious education in our government schools. One of the possibilities for the government will be to consider how to incorporate into legislation many of the principles enshrined in those international treaties on religious freedom to which we are signatory. In the meantime I would urge you to bring to the attention of Paul Fletcher any of your own experiences where you have experienced discrimination because of your religious convictions. Only in this way will the Government be responsive to our concerns about the protection of religious freedoms in Australia.

We are now progressing at speed with the project of our Parish Bell Tower. I cannot express enough my gratitude to Peter Georgiades, the architect and manager of the project. Peter is working tirelessly in the background, with so much commitment and professionalism. A builder has been appointed, Chris Hawkett who is the son-in-law of Chris and Julie Madden. The final plans for the engineering and construction are being drawn up and hopefully we will have our tower by the 70th anniversary of the foundation of our parish: Saturday 18 March! Watch this space!

Supporting the Higher Education of a Priest

In the words of Pope Benedict XVI, "*without well-educated priests, the New Evangelisation will be just a slogan.*" And Pope St. John Paul II: "*The formation of future priests ... is considered by the Church as one of its most demanding and important tasks.*" The higher education of priests is carried out mainly at Pontifical Universities. Graduates of these universities become lecturers at seminaries or are given other positions of responsibility in dioceses. Some are appointed Bishops. In all, they are key players in the enormous task of carrying out the mission entrusted by Jesus to the Church. Companies everywhere strive to have the best educated people in their staff. The Church, even though it counts on the grace of God, also needs educated priests and Bishops. Ordinarily, the Bishops defray the costs of educating their priests. Some Bishops from developing countries are not able to support the costs. Without help, many promising young men who could become excellent workers in the vineyard of Our Lord, are excluded from higher education. In the last academic year, for instance, the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross was able to grant 210 scholarships, but 65 other candidates worthy of being helped could not be assisted for lack of supporters. This is a great loss for the Church and the world. Due to the scarcity of Australian-born priests, many overseas Bishops have come to our rescue sending us the priests we badly needed. How can we express our gratitude to them for this act of charity? One way of doing it could be to contribute to fund the education of their priests.

An Sri-Lankan priest, studying at the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome needs a scholarship. **Fr. Christy Paul Jabamalai** was born in Nuware Eliya, Sri Lanka. His father and mother had moved from India to Sri Lanka where both worked as Tea Estate Workers, a job carried out ordinarily by poor Indian migrants. At present he is studying towards a Licenza (Master) of Theology at the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome. With the authorization of his Bishop, Fr. Jabamalai applied for a scholarship of €10,500 (\$A16,000) for the academic year 2016 to 2017. The Pontifical University checked that the scholarship was needed, and asked if it could be provided from Australia.
