The Columbans are a missionary society of priests who work in 16 countries including: Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Britain, Ireland, China, Japan, Korea, Myanmar (former Burma), Philippines, Taiwan, Pakistan, Chile, Peru, Brazil, and the United States. Columban Fathers work in cooperation with lay people and Columban Sisters from a standpoint of solidarity with the poor and integrity of creation. We recognise the moral challenge of worldwide and local poverty. It means supporting the struggle of the poor for real participation and against injustice. St Columbans Mission Society was formally founded in 1918 and takes its name from St Columban, Ireland's sixth century missionary to Europe.

We pray that the year ahead will be full of wonderful opportunities for learning.

World Youth Day 2019 Update

Our WYD2019 pilgrims have had a wonderful experience over the last two weeks, culminating in the Vigil Mass and sleepout and final Mass over the weekend. They are now on their final journey, heading to Houston tonight our time, then on to Sydney, where they will arrive on Thursday morning.

In his Welcome to World Youth Day, Pope Francis spoke to the pilgrims and the youth of the world about joyful hope: "Peter and the Church walk with you, and we want to tell you not to be afraid, to go forward with the same fresh energy and restlessness that helps make us happier and more available, better witnesses to the Gospel. To go forward, not to create a parallel Church that would be more "fun" or "cool" thanks to a fancy youth event, as if that were all you needed or wanted. That way of thinking would not respect either you or everything that the Spirit is saying through you. Not at all!

With you, we want to rediscover and reawaken the Church's constant freshness and youth, opening ourselves to a new Pentecost (cf. SYNOD ON YOUNG PEOPLE, Final Document, 60). As we experienced at the Synod, this can only happen if, by our listening and sharing, we encourage each other to keep walking and to bear witness by proclaiming the Lord through service to our brothers and sisters, and concrete service at that."
