

# Upcoming Events

Dear friends,

Last Saturday 26 May we learnt the sad news of the death of Alex Koroknay, husband of Pam. Alex had been unwell for some time but his deterioration came unexpectedly. We extend our deepest sympathy to Pam and her family at this very sad time. Alex was a wonderful member of the Pymble Uniting Church, and he will be farewelled from there, the corner of Pacific Highway and Livingstone Avenue, Pymble this Monday, 4 June at 10:30am. Eternal rest grant unto Alex, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine on him.



On Sunday last, one of our neighbours had the distressing experience of their car parked on Billyard Ave being 'sideswiped' by one of our parishioners leaving Mass. Regretfully, the parishioner did not stop to report the accident or to leave their details. This is most unfortunate, and reflects badly on us as a community for whom the care of others' property should be paramount. Please be careful when parking, and if an accident should ever occur, either on the street or in the carpark, please be sure to do the responsible and civic duty which is always to apologise, to leave one's details and to assume the cost of damage that may have occurred.

As you know, through the month of May we have been undertaking a Count of those attending our Parish Masses. I am very happy to share with you that the average number of people attending our Parish of a weekend is 620. This is a very slight increase on the figure of 2017 (619), but a very significant rise from the figure of 5 years ago, in 2013 (517). So we can have a great sense of gratitude that our community continues to be a place where people experience a great sense of welcome and inclusion—particularly in such challenging times for the wider Catholic community.

This week, our painters are here with us again, attending to the timber external doors to the church. These are in great need of repair and renovation. We have also been able to begin to replace the gas heaters in our church, given that the 30 year old ones are, one by one, coming to the end of their life. We have already replaced two, and in the coming weeks will replace another two.

This Sunday, Jo and I will be trekking 60km of the Larapinta Trail near Alice Springs to raise funds to launch a new urgently needed Mission Australia service in the Northern Territory called Missionbeat.

As the CEO of Mission Australia, I've seen firsthand the impact Missionbeat has already made in Sydney, Brisbane, Perth and Tasmania, and I know its expansion to the NT will make a significant positive impact. Missionbeat staff aim to meet people's immediate needs, providing food, clothing, medical care and links to safe accommodation where possible. They also work in close collaboration with other organisations to help break the cycle of homelessness for individuals and families.

That's why I'm taking on this challenge - alongside my wife Jo and a number of other enthusiastic Mission Australia supporters and why I'm asking for your help. I would be so grateful if you could support me and Jo with a donation. Every dollar you give will go directly towards launching Missionbeat in the NT as Jo and I have already covered the expenses associated with the trip. Your donation will be an investment into the lives and futures of vulnerable young Australians in desperate need. The captain of the ferry gave us a commentary on the history of the river and it's surrounds. In the early days of the colony the river became the lifeline between the fertile lands of Windsor and Richmond which supplied a lot of the food to the colony. The building of the rail bridge provided the link between the States and led the way for federation in 1901.

Everyone in our party enjoyed the ferry trip and found it both relaxing and informative.

The next outing for the group is on **Friday 29th June 2018** visiting the Maritime Museum at Darling Harbour to see the current exhibition.

We will meet on the Concourse of Gordon Station at 10.00 am to take the next train to Central Station and then go by light rail to the Maritime Museum. Once we arrive we can have morning tea and then visit the exhibition. After seeing the exhibition we can have lunch and then visit the naming wall to see the names of visitors who have placed their names there.

Finally we can take the light rail back to Central and then the North Shore train back to Gordon.


