Dear friends,

In the gospel of St. Mark (Mk 5:21-43) we have two miracles of Jesus, who heals two women—one from death and one from illness. Mark stresses that both the woman with the haemorrhage and the daughter of Jairus were beyond the help of earthly power. He further stresses the great faith of the woman who had haemorrhaged for twelve years without any benefit from physicians, while the 12 year old daughter of Jairus had died. Through faith in Jesus both are cured and saved.

Every time Jesus healed someone it took power out of him. The greatness of Jesus was that he was prepared to pay the price of helping others. We, are following in his footsteps when we give ourselves in helping others.

For all of us, there is the ministry of accompaniment. Just being present to the sick person is enough for them. Like Jesus we give of our love and concern, but what a beautiful gift to give to another who is suffering.

Called to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, in healing and caring for the sick and dying, may we give of ourselves as he gave of himself in dying on the cross to save us all.

Confirmation, Baptism and Family Masses



Start with: CONFIRMATION

Eligibility: Candidates must be Baptised, aged 8 or older and be in at least **Year 3** at school. In our Diocese of Broken Bay, the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated **before** Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Parents and Carers - Welcome and Information Evening:
Attendance is compulsory for one Parent/Carer on either Wednesday 24th July or Tuesday 30th July, 7.00-8.00pm in the Veritas Hall at Prouille School, 5 Water Street, Wahroonga. This is an information evening for parents/carers, which includes refreshments. Children usually do not attend, but discuss this with Sally if necessary.

Tuesday 6 August, 7.00pm, Sunroom at the Church

Sacramental Preparation Groups:

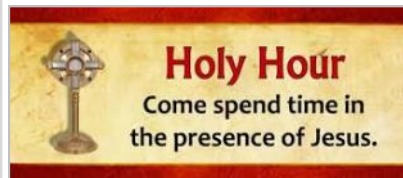

Days to Remember this Week



St Thomas - Feast Day 3 July

St. Thomas was Jewish and was called to be one of the twelve Apostles. His feast day is celebrated July 3.

He lived before the formal establishment of the Catholic Church and is recognised as the Patron Saint of India.

He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas."

Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas was gently rebuked for his skepticism and furnished with the evidence he had demanded - seeing in Christ's hands the point of the nails. Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side.

After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus—declaring the faith of the Church.

Coming soon—NAIDOC Week 2024

Held across the country from 7-14 July 2024, NAIDOC Week will celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

This year's theme chosen by the National NAIDOC Committee, is Keep the Fire Burning! Blak, Loud & Proud.

The theme honours the enduring strength and vitality of First Nations culture – with fire a symbol of connection to Country, to each other, and to the rich tapestry of traditions that define Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.



KEEP THE FIRE BURNING! BLAK, LOUD AND PROUD

7-14 JULY 2024

Aboriginal Elder, Catholic and educator, Miriam-Rose Ungummerr provides a bridge between Aboriginal spirituality in the traditional form and one which is thoroughly at home in the Catholic Tradition. She has described a form of contemplation, called in her own language dadirri:

*"It is inner, deep listening and quiet, still awareness,
Dadirri recognises the deep spring that is inside us.
We call on it and it calls on us.
This is the gift that Australia is calling for.
It is something like what you call 'contemplation'.
When I experience 'dadirri', I am made whole again.
I can sit on the river bank
or walk through the trees;
even if someone close to me has passed away,
I can find peace in this silent awareness...
The other part of 'daddirri' is the quiet stillness
and the waiting.
Our Aboriginal culture has taught us to be still and to wait.
We do not try to hurry things up.
We let them follow their natural courses - like the seasons.
We watch the moon in each of its phases.
We wait for the rain to fill our rivers and
water the thirsty earth.
When twilight comes, we prepare for night.
At dawn we rise with the sun...
There are deep springs within each one of us.
Within this deep spring,
which is the very Spirit of God, is a sound.
The sound is Deep calling to Deep.
The sound is the Word of God - Jesus."*

Despite all the horrendous stories of injustice and the untold thousands of chapters that could be written on the matter, it is heartening to recognise the mothers who have battled and largely succeeded in holding Indigenous families together. Despite predictions to the contrary, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people continue to survive and to maintain a significant place in this Commonwealth of Australia.

And for that we rejoice in humble gratitude.

The dark abyss of Aboriginal History in Australia, as we know it, has been remarkably bathed in the light that emanates from the goodness, and the heroic efforts, of many people who are driven by a sense of charity and a longing for what is right. Most notably among these people are numerous mothers in Indigenous Communities throughout the land whose love and determination have achieved inspirational things for themselves and their families.
