What does the Word of God say to us this Sunday - 18th Sunday Year

First reading (Ecclesiastes 1:2, 2:21-23). This section of Wisdom literature is full of disillusionment and restless questioning of all the old certainties, not even sure of the after-life. It queries whether happiness is anywhere to be found, certainly not in hard work! The author questions what is the point of all our labour and toil, and all the cares of life.

Second reading (Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11). Once we have been baptised into Christ, we have been taken on as his own, and can securely address God with trust as Father. This gives us confidence in our continuing struggle to shake off all evil and allow Christ to take control of every aspect of our lives. We still 'are being transformed into Christ', but the battle is already won.

Gospel (Luke 12.13-21). The Parable of the rich fool emerges from Jesus' response to a request from someone in the immense crowd (Luke 12:1) that Jesus arbitrate between him and his brother in the matter of an inheritance. Jesus not only denies the request, but makes it the basis for a warning against greed and a reliance on wealth for security of the soul.

The 'parable of the rich fool' reflects a central theme of Jesus' teaching in Luke's Gospel: the problem of wealth in the context of the holy kingdom, where closeness to God is life and attachment to wealth and material things reflects soulstifling anxiety and fear. Foolishness is associated with greed and with the neglect of justice and the love of God and neighbour.

"By virtue of the Holy Spirit, Baptism immerses us in the death and resurrection of the Lord, drowning 'the old self' in the baptismal font, dominated by the sin that divides us from God, and giving birth to 'the new self' recreated in Christ."

The Call to the Priesthood:

"It is true, brothers and sisters, that God

has made his entire people a royal priesthood in Christ. But our High Priest, Jesus Christ, also chose some of his followers to carry out publicly in the Church a priestly ministry in his name on behalf of mankind. They were elected by the Lord Jesus, not to further their careers, but to offer this service. By consecration, they will be made true priests of the New Testament, to preach the Gospel, sustain God's people, and celebrate the Liturgy, above all, the Lord's sacrifice.

My beloved sons and brothers, you are now to be advanced to the order of the Presbyterate. You must apply your energies to the duty of teaching in the name of Christ, the chief Teacher. Share with all mankind the Word of God you received with joy as children. Meditate on the law of God, believe what you read, teach what you believe, and put into practice what you teach."

Saints We Remember this Week

St Alphonsus Liguori—27 September 1696 – 1 August 1787 Feast Day - 1 August



Sometimes called Alphonsus Maria de Liguori or Saint Alphonsus Liguori, was an Italian Catholic bishop and theologian. He founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, known as the Redemptorists, in November 1732.

A successful lawyer before age 20, Alphonsus used his legal skills lifelong in his writing and the governance of his order and his diocese. He was ordained in 1717 and immediately became well-known as a compassionate confessor and down-to-earth preacher. "I have never preached a sermon," he said, "that the poorest old woman in the congregation could not understand." You can hear his gentle voice in the following excerpt that also suggests the secret behind his perseverance:

"Our faith will give us confidence in our difficulties, teaching us that whoever prays will be saved. May our faith make us always live with the thought of eternity. Let's keep ever before our eyes this great thought—everything in this world comes to an end, whether it be prosperity or adversity. Eternity alone never ends..."


In 1748, St. Alphonsus published his Moral Theology . At age sixty-six, he reluctantly accepted appointment as Bishop and worked hard for thirteen years to renew his flock. The community endured and today has missionaries serving throughout the world. St. Alphonsus Liguori died on August 1, 1787, two months before his ninety-first birthday.

St Dominic - 1170-1221 Feast Day 3 August (1170 – 6 August 1221)

He was born in Caleruega, Spain. He is sometimes called Dominic of Osma or Dominic de Guzmán. He was educated by his uncle, a priest. Dominic became a priest and joined a religious community. Soon he became the prior, or head.

Dominic saw that those sent by the Pope to preach lived in comfort. The people would not accept their teaching because their lives did not support what they taught. Dominic, his bishop, and three Cistercian monks went from city to city preaching the truth of Christ, using the Bible. They went on foot, depending on others for food and a place to sleep. Soon people returned to the faith—not only because of what these preachers said, but because of how they lived. By 1215 a few men had joined Dominic in his work of preaching. He founded the Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans.

While St. Dominic was on a preaching mission through northern Italy, he died, only six years after he had founded his community.

May God the Holy Spirit, who gives us life, move within us.


May God give us eyes to see to God, ears to hear God, and hands to bring God's work into the world.

Saints We Remember this Week

St John Vianney—Feast Day 4 August

- **1786** Born in Dardilly, France. Lives as a poor farm boy and shepherd with his family.
- **1806** Begins formal seminary school very late because of family's financial state. Does not excel in studies and is expelled because of his considerable difficulties with Latin.
- **1810** Is drafted into the French Army, but frail health forces him to miss his recruiting call.
- **1815** Sponsored by a local priest, he re-enters the seminary and is ordained at age 30.
- **1818** Assigned to small parish of Ars as its pastor.
- **1824** Starts La Providence, a home for orphan girls.
- **1855** Is hearing 20,000 confessions a year. (This number will increase to nearly 75,000.)
- **1856** Receives the French Legion of Honor.
- 1859 Dies on August 4 (his current feast day).
- 1905 Beatified by Pius X.
- 1925 Canonised and named Patron Saint of Parish Priests.

O Christ our God, so that when they should see you crucified they would understand that your Passion was voluntary, and proclaim to the world that you truly are the splendour of the Father."


