Reflection


On Pentecost day the apostles spoke a new language. What was this new language?

Through the gift of the Spirit, people of different languages learned to profess one faith, to the praise and glory of God. This is the real miracle of Pentecost, and it is a miracle which, thankfully, still happens.


What is PENTECOST?



PENTECOST comes from the Greek word "Pentecoste" meaning 50th day. Pentecost Sunday is one of the most prominent feast days in the Christian calendar. It is often referred to as the "BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH".

It marks the day when the HOLY SPIRIT descended upon the Apostles, who had been living in fear for fifty days following the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

On Pentecost, the HOLY SPIRIT came down visibly on the Apostles. He gave them the power to speak in strange tongues to the crowds that came to Jerusalem for that Feast. He also transformed them, from selfish and timid men into giants of courage and faith.



Saints We Remember This Week



St Barnabas—Feast Day 11 June

Barnabas was an early Christian mentioned in the New Testament. According to Acts 4:36, his original name was Joseph 15:32). In many English translations of the Bible, Barnabas is called an apostle. In Acts 14:14 of these translations, he is listed ahead of Paul, "Barnabas and Paul," instead of "Paul and Barnabas;" both men being described as apostles.

He is one of the first prophets and teachers of the church. Luke speaks of him as a "good man" (11:24). He was born of Jewish parents of the tribe of Levi. His aunt was the mother of John, surnamed Mark (Colossians 4:10). He was a native of Cyprus, where he had a possession of land which he sold, and gave the proceeds to the church in Jerusalem. In *Acts 13:4-12* Saul, Barnabas & John (Mark), their helper went to Cyprus to proclaim the Word of God. "We must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God" *Acts 14:22b*. Paul describes Barnabas as a hard worker *1 Corinthians 9:6*

The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church



On Monday 6th June, we honour Mary as Mother of the Church, for from the cross Jesus turns to St John (representing all the faithful) saying "Behold your mother" – and we are told that from that time he made a place for her in his heart, in his home.

Are we able to make a place for her in our hearts, and in our homes?

It is evident from St Luke's Gospel, that Mary was held in a place of honour from the time of the infant Christian community. Already she was revered as the Mother of God and Mother of all believers, the one 'whom all generations will called Blessed'.

Mary always points the way to Christ, her Son. "Do whatever he commands" she will say at Cana. She will gather with the disciples to await the coming of the Spirit, and the birth of the Church.

"Mary.... following in her footsteps, we will not lose our way; praying to her we will not despair; thinking about her, we will not be deluded. If she takes us by the hand, we will not fall; if she guides us we will not know fatigue; if she is with us, we will reach our destination."

(St Bernard of Clairvaulx)

Upon creating the feast in 2018, Pope Francis said he wished to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful.

"Our new feast day is an invitation for each of us to receive more from Mary's example of holiness and from the grace of her Son that she offers us,". "Let us not be afraid to ask her prayers for ourselves and for the whole Church: O Mary, Mother of Christ, and Mother of the Church, pray for us that we might be made worthy of the promises of your Son!"
