From Fr Paul

This year the Catholic Church in Australia celebrates **National Vocation Awareness Week** from 7-14 August. This is an opportunity to celebrate the call of all the Baptised and to promote vocations to the Ordained Ministry and Consecrated Life. Where such a Vocation is concerned, God speaks, God calls: we do not choose, but discern, listen and obey, and in that, we will find our deepest happiness and fulfilment.

Bishop Anthony Randazzo reminds us all of our Baptismal call and of the unique call which God makes to each of us. Bishop Anthony also encourages us to pray to the Lord for Vocations, to the Lord who is always calling.

Scripture attests that God calls people at all stages of their lives, whether it's a young boy like Jeremiah or Samuel, or to someone like Abraham who's asked as an old man to leave everything he's known and set off 'for a land that I will show you'. (note today's second reading) Throughout the Scriptures and throughout the history of the Church, we have examples of God's specific call on the life of particular people.

It was very special to celebrate the **First Holy Communion** of 38 of our children last weekend. We continue to pray for these children and their families that they will respond to the Eucharistic Lord who wishes to be united with them. (See Page...)

This will assist Principals and School Executive to run similar days for their own staff and school communities. What does the Word of God say to us this Sunday - 19th Sunday Year C?

First reading (Wisdom 18:6-9). Just as God delivered the Jewish people in Egypt, so he will save those who put their trust in him. **Second reading (Hebrew 11:1-2, 8-19).** We are called to imitate the faith of the patriarchs, especially that of Abraham, 'our father in faith.'

Gospel (Luke 12:32-48). Through the parable of the waiting servants Jesus urges us to constant watchfulness and faithfulness.

The **First Reading** is an extract from a long section which recounts God's actions on behalf of Israel during the Exodus from Egypt. It points out how the Israelites benefited from the very things by which the Egyptians were punished and thus sets forth a historical basis for trust in God.

This fits in with the theme of the **Second Reading**, which deals with faith in God's promises. It extols various figures in the history of Israel, but especially Abraham, as examples of faith.

The emphasis in the **Gospel** is on readiness for the return of the Lord. Even though the disciples are only a 'little flock' in a hostile world, they must not be discouraged, but must look with confidence to the Father who has chosen them for his kingdom. They are like bridesmaids waiting for the bridegroom (Jesus) to return from the wedding feast. Since they do not know the exact hour of his return, they must maintain a constant watchfulness and faithfulness. Though these words have relevance for all Christians, Luke was thinking especially of leaders in the community, and calling them to a selfless service of their Lord and of their fellow Christians.

Like the people of God in the first and second readings, and like the good stewards in today's Gospel, we are each invited to trust in God always, to hold firm to our faith in every situation and to always be prepared when the Lord calls us at the end of our earthly life (or pilgrimage).

As we celebrate our vocation, or consider how God may be calling us in our life, may we ponder these points:

- How would I describe my life of faith? Am I like the faithful servant always ready and prepared for the return of the Master?
- How do I respond to those words from Jesus: "Do not be afraid"?
- Do I listen for the voice of God? How do I respond to the call of God in my life?


The Call to the Priesthood:



Saints We Remember this Week


St Mary MacKillop (Saint Mary of the Cross) Feast Day - 8 August

Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842 and died in Sydney on 8 August 1909.

She took the religious name Mary of the Cross. She treasured those words of St Paul "May I never boast, except in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of Religious Life to provide education for their children. She and her Sisters (the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart) shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children.

She is remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of falsehoods spoken about her, and for her abiding trust in God's providence.



In June 1995 Mary MacKillop was beatified by Pope John Paul II. In February 2010, after evaluating the testimony of an Australian woman who claimed that her terminal cancer had disappeared after she called upon Mary MacKillop in prayer, Pope Benedict XVI recognised Mary as a saint and she was canonised on 17 October.

"Whatever troubles may be before you, accept them bravely remembering whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you all your life. God will reward you as only He can."

"We must let no obstacles deter us from proceeding with courage in the path marked out for us. It may sometimes be dark and full of windings, but a beautiful bright light shines at the end of this path and a few more windings will bring us to it."



St Lawrence (31 December 225AD - 10 August 258AD) Feast Day 10 August

Lawrence was a deacon of the Church of Rome. The tradition about Lawrence is that he was a Deacon from Spain in the service of Pope Sixtus II. He was put in charge of the administration of Church goods and care for the poor. He is also regarded as one of the first archivists and treasurers of the Church.

He died at Rome on this day in 258, four days after Saint Sixtus II, with whom he was closely associated. Honoured for his almsgiving, he became, after the apostles, the most celebrated martyr of the Church of Rome. His worship spread throughout the Church and he was named in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon), and in many ancient Roman churches dedicated to him.

St Clare (16 July 1194 - 11 August 1253) Feast Day 11 August

As a young girl, Saint Clare was inspired by the example of Saint Francis and his friars to leave the comforts of her aristocratic home and embrace the life of holy poverty, receiving the habit at the Saint's hands. The nuns who gathered around her eventually became known as the Poor Clares, whose life of prayer and frugality is well known to this day.

St. Clare became sick and suffered great pains for many years, but she expressed that no pain could trouble her. So great was her joy in serving the Lord that she once exclaimed: "They say that we are too poor, but can a heart which possesses the infinite God be truly called poor?"
