

## From Fr Davíd ín Rome

Just as our week began on Monday with Mass at one of the major Basilicas in Rome, St Peter's so our week on Friday evening concluded with Mass at the Cathedral Church of Rome, where the successor to St Peter, the Bishop of Rome has his Cathedra (his seat). The two celebrations provided the most remarkable 'book-ends' to our week here in Rome.

Normally, Ad Liminas are conducted over two weeks; ours has been held over the course of one ahead of 29 June, the Solemnity of Sts Peter and Paul, after which Rome 'closes' for the summer break. This has meant that all our days have been quite intense with a succession of meetings. The last two days have been no exception.

On Thursday 27 June, following Mass at Domus Australia I had a personal meeting with representatives of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith over a matter of business, before then joining some of the Bishops with Cardinal Sandri and the Congregation for Oriental Churches. It was good to hear the Eastern-Rite Bishops of Australia share their concerns and questions. Later in the afternoon, another group of us joined Archbishop Miguel Angel Ayuso Guixot, President of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue to hear of the Vatican's initiatives in this area. In between I managed to do just a little shopping during the first two spare hours that I have found through the week, though I must admit this was more of an attempt to find some air-conditioning to relieve the heat and humidity Rome has been suffering!



Throughout this week we have been greatly supported by the members of a new ecclesial entity, L'Opera della Chiesa (The Work of the Church) founded some 60 years ago in Spain, and which now has several communities in Rome. It is this community that has ministered to us in transport to all of our various meetings and liturgies.

On Thursday evening a group of us were privileged to join the community in the suburbs of Rome to learn more about their Institute and to enjoy their hospitality. They have an interesting charism of 'ecclesiality' at the service of Bishops and the Church. Back at Domus Australia, it was lovely to catch up with Jodie Crisafulli, our Diocesan Director for Safeguarding, who has come to Rome for a conference beginning early next week, and our dear friends, Annie and James Carrett who are also 'in town' with Archbishop Comensoli.

Despite the intense, record-breaking heat being suffered in Rome we maintained our pace on the last day: an early personal meeting with representatives from the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life followed by a group meeting with Cardinal De Aviz and Archbishop Carballo; a large group meeting with Cardinal Versaldi and Archbishop Zani and the Congregation for Catholic Education; a whole of group meeting with Archbishop Paul Gallagher of the Secretariat for State in the Apostolic Palace; a concluding Reception with H.E Melissa Hitchman, Australian Ambassador to the Holy See, at the Embassy, situated quite near the Vatican. The night has concluded with a dinner to toast Archbishop Comensoli who has been joined by his family from Wollongong and who tomorrow will be given the Pallium (a liturgical garment) signifying his status as Metropolitan Archbishop of Melbourne.

It has been the most remarkable week of encounters which have generated a great deal of thought for me and various ideas. Each meeting has left me with several new ideas or perspectives. Given the fullness of each day, and the tiresome heat, it will take me some time to digest it all.



However, with the Lord's grace, I pray that the many insights will help continue to form me in my ministry and service for the benefit of our Diocese which I have held very close to my heart through the entire adventure.


## Parísh Events

Once arriving at Sophie's Lookout at Cremorne Point we had coffee at a cafe and admired views looking to the Opera House and the Harbour Bridge. We then walked to Robertson's Lookout and Lighthouse, passing by pleasant native trees and shrubs. At this point, views could be had of the City, Eastern Suburbs and Mosman Bay. Turning back from here we then walked along a path towards Mosman Bay with large Federation style homes to our left and the nature strip which was on our right running down to the waters edge. This area had become popular with Sydney siders not long after the first fleet had arrived, early painters such as Streeton had found inspiration from the wonderful views of the harbour. After travelling approximately four kilometres along the path and climbing several steps we finally arrived at the Mosman Rowing Club where we had lunch. The meal was enjoyable and was complimented by the views of Mosman Bay. Once we had finished lunch we returned by ferry to Circular Quay and took a train back home.

## Fr Davíd ín Rome

Wednesday 26 June 2019- Rome is sweltering under a heat wave, the days reaching 38 degrees with very high humidity. Nonetheless, the work of the *Ad Limina* goes on! It has been a very busy couple of days.




One of the principal activities of the pilgrimage is to visit the four major basilicas of the city. As I shared previously, we visited St Peter's Basilica on Monday. However, on Tuesday we gathered with Archbishop Fisher at 7.30am for Mass at Santa Maria Maggiore not far from where we are staying; on Wednesday at 4.00pm with Archbishop Comensoli at St Paul's Outside the Walls, the giant Basilica built upon the tomb of the great apostolic missionary, St Paul. It is here, also, where lies the grave of the first Australian Aboriginal religious in Rome, Francis Xavier Conaci, a novice from the Benedictine Monastery in New Norcia, Western Australia, who died in Rome on 10 October 1853. Just as before the tomb of St Peter the Bishops gathered to pray the Apostles' Creed, so did we pray the Profession of Faith at the tomb of St Paul. However, we also then processed to the place where Francis Xavier Conaci is buried underneath the floor of the Basilica. We remembered him and all our Aboriginal brothers and sisters. It was a powerful gesture of solidarity with them and with all of the Church in Australia from this distant place.


The *Ad Limina* is not only an opportunity to meet with the Holy Father. It is also a time to meet with his primary collaborators - the various Roman Offices who assist him in his ministry. Across the last two days we have had a succession of meetings: all of us have met as a group with Cardinal Marc Ouellet and the Congregation for Bishops; with Cardinal Ferrer and Archbishop Scicluna of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith; with Cardinal Stella and Archbishop Patron Wong and the Congregation for Clergy. We have discussed various issues related to the forthcoming Plenary Council, the nature of the sacramental seal of Confession, the formation of clergy among other matters, I, along with others, have also had the opportunity to meet with Monsignor Robert Oliver and the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors, and Cardinal Ravasi and Bishop Paul Tighe of the Pontifical Council for Culture. I have also been received personally by Cardinal Ouellet to help me clarify various matters pertinent to our time of Diocesan Administration. Everyone has received us warmly and with generosity in meetings lasting 60-90 minutes. They all have a clear sense of the Australian context and our exchange with them has been both informative and constructive. Personally, I have found them to be educative and enriching, frustrated only by the shortness of time to engage further the various issues that are canvassed. Notwithstanding, there is a clear sense conveyed that the Roman offices are at the service of the various national contexts and wish to be in open dialogue. The calibre, too, of the leadership of the various dicasteries is impressive: people who are formed theologically, who have the most remarkable international perspective, but also who are very pastoral in their concern.

Our little convoy of buses has been kept busy transporting us across the city each day. However, in the midst of official engagements there has also been a little opportunity to see familiar faces. On Tuesday I enjoyed lunch with Fr Tony Banks now on the Augustinian Fathers General Council, and Fr Dave Austin from our Parish of North Harbour, at the Augustinian Generalate which has perhaps the best view of St Peter's in all of Rome. Then, in the evening I joined friends from Melbourne, per chance currently in Rome this week, for a wonderful Italian dinner. And, of course, there is always the time to enjoy a cold Italian beer or a wonderfully refreshing gelato!

Two further days of meetings await us, as does an intensifying Roman heatwave!
