

Upcomíng Events

Dear friends,

On Tuesday morning we will farewell Monique Steger from our church. Monique passed away tragically on 24 March. She will be well known to many from her days at Prouille. We extend to all her family our deepest sympathy.

We also remember very much in our prayers, the brother of Pat Macmillan, Brian who has died in New Zealand, and the brother of John McGarry, Raymond who passed away this last week too after a long illness. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them.

As part of my year of Silver Anniversary of Ordination, Bishop Peter has very graciously granted me a period of sabbatical this year. I am now very happy to share with you the details of this period of leave. The period of sabbatical will be for the months of July and August through to 10 September. From 2 July to 8 July I will be in Tasmania with my father. Then from 9 July to 3 August I will enter into a 30 day retreat in western NSW near Condobolin. This will be a wonderful opportunity for personal and spiritual renewal. On 8 August I leave for two weeks in the Holy Land (Jerusalem and Jordan) for renewal in Scripture, and then fly to Paris on 24 August to meet with Archdiocesan officials in respect to models of priestly formation and the lay apostolate. From Paris I will journey down to Lourdes, where I have never visited before, and then I will make my way to Lyons before flying home to Sydney via Hanoi, in Vietnam. As you can imagine I am very excited about this unique possibility, coming as it does 25 years after Ordination, the year before I turn 60, and, indeed, half way through my appointment as Parish Priest, the term of which finishes in May 2021. I am also very grateful to you all for your generosity at the celebration of my Silver Anniversary last November which I have been able to place at the service of the trip. Most of the details of the trip have now been arranged.

Whilst I am on leave, the priests of the Parish of St Ives will assume pastoral responsibility for our parish. I am very grateful, too, to them for their generosity in this respect. The Carmelite community there will ensure that the life of the parish, particularly in respect to all our Masses, will continue without interruption.

And a special thank you to you all for allowing me this time!



About Divine Mercy Sunday....

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. It also has links to the Bible and the readings of this day. We are encouraged to offer forgiveness and reconciliation to all, go to Confession, attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. It is based on visions recorded from St. Faustian Kowalski.

When was it made part of the Church's calendar?

In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and, during the ceremony, he declared:

It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church *will be called "Divine Mercy Sunday"*.

Divine Mercy Sunday is an Observance in the Roman Catholic Church in which followers are encouraged to offer forgiveness and reconciliation to all. It is based on visions recorded from St. Faustian Kowalski. In 2000, it was decreed a

solemnity, a high feast day, by Pope John Paul II. Roman Catholics are required to attend worship, go to confession, and take Holy Communion. Divine Mercy Sunday occurs the Sunday after Easter.


