Dear friends,

As you can see we have implemented the idea emerged from our Parish Pastoral Council about making our church more hospitable for those who require assistance with mobility. We have removed the pews in the front of each section on the eastern side of the church and replaced them with chairs which can easily be re-arranged to accommodate those with wheelchairs or walkers. In time, we will invest in some more attractive chairs for these areas so that their style and colour fit more into the aesthetic of the church.

A very special thank you to all those who worked as hard to make the Bach Akademie Concert so successful last Sunday afternoon. We really were treated to such a special event of glorious music. The Bach Akademie expresses how much it enjoys performing in our beautiful church and we are hopeful that they will join us again in 2020 for four separate occasions. In this way we are truly realising our community aspiration to become a centre of fine sacred music.

Our year is fast coming to an end, especially for our school students. On Thursday St Lucy's celebrated its Year 6 Graduation and on Friday St Edmund's College celebrated its final Mass for the year and its farewell to all its Year 12 students. A thought to make our church more hospitable

Following our very constructive Parish Pastoral Council meeting in October which focused on Safeguarding and Disabilities, the suggestion has been made to make our church more hospitable to those who may require assistance with mobility. The suggestion has been raised to remove the first pew in both the front and second halves of the western side of the church (that side on which we have parking for disability) thereby creating space for wheelchairs and walkers. Currently, we do not have reserved space for these, and so people can often feel that they are in the way or blocking the aisles. It might be that we invest in some appropriate single chairs which can easily be moved to replace the pews. These single chairs will also allow friends and family of the one with mobility difficulties to be beside them during Mass. The Pastoral Council was vey much in favour of this suggestion. We would place discreet signs on the western side of the church sharing the availability of this space. Hopefully, we might be able to introduce this initiative prior to Christmas.



Some Recent Parish Pastoral Developments

Safeguarding is the term we use today to express our commitment to ensure that our community is a place of safety and care for all those in our parish, especially children and those who are vulnerable. These are the ways by which as a community we seek to do this. Our Parish seeks to fulfil the 10 Child Safety Standards introduced by the recent Royal Commission and not enshrine in the NSW Office of the Child Guardian With Diocesan support we comply with all legislation in respect to child safety All those who are in a child-related activity in the Parish require a validated NSW Working with Children Clearance Those who are visiting the elderly in their homes and those with financial responsibility in our Parish require a National **Criminal History Check** Our Clergy must attend a compulsory seminar in Safeguarding annually each year Any visiting clergy in our church must be identified in an audited Register and be cleared by the Diocese to do so Our Parish Staff must be inducted in Safeguarding and attend regular Safeguarding update seminars From 2020 we will be trained in Self-Assessment of Catholic Professional Standards Ltd Child Safety Standards, Criteria and Indicators; Our Parish Catechists are trained in Safeguarding We have literature on Safeguarding freely available at the entrance to our church We include Safeguarding material in induction packs for our volunteers We include Safeguarding material in our Baptismal Preparation packs and available for our parents enrolling their children at Prouille. Detailed information on Safeguarding exists on our Parish Website. We conduct the Sacrament of Reconciliation for Children in an open space, in line of sight of other adults We welcome parents to be in the Sacristy with their children who might be acting as Altar Servers.

- Before and after Masses, the sacristy doors should be completely open allowing total visibility from the "crying room" foyer;
- Parents are welcome also to accompany their children to Sunday morning Children's Liturgy
- We have refurbished our Confessionals to bring them into compliance with current standards and expectations
- We are to install security cameras in the Parish Sunroom so that the areas of our church are visible at all times
- For Parish functions using our beautiful garden space, we allocate two identifiable "Safeguarding Officers" to patrol the whole parish site to ensure the safety of our children at all times

Outcomes of our Parish Pastoral Council Meeting on Tuesday 19 November re our Parish Participation in the journey towards the Plenary Council of 2020-2021

Through the "Listening Phase" of the journey towards the Plenary Council which opens in October 2019, six themes emerged for consideration in the current "Discernment Phase." The six themes are about a Christ-centred Church which is

- Missionary and evangelising
- Inclusive, participatory and synodal
- Prayerful and Eucharistic
- Humble, healing and merciful
- A joyful, hope filled and servant community
- Open to conversion, renewal and reform

You will see posters reflecting these themes on the wall of our church.

Next year, we will take these themes and ask, "What might these mean for us a parish community?"

We propose to do this in several ways:

- In February we will host a community evening with Dr Paul Collins, historian and social commentator about the themes;
- **During Lent** we will invite our community to **pray** these themes. On each of the six Thursdays of Lent we will invite our parishioners to come together for a meal at Prouille followed by a guided prayer and faith reflection on each theme;
- In the second half of the year we will stage a facilitated process of six parish forums, each on a theme, discussing how the theme might be realised in our own context. The outcomes of the forums will be at the service of developing a 3 year strategic pastoral plan for our community.
