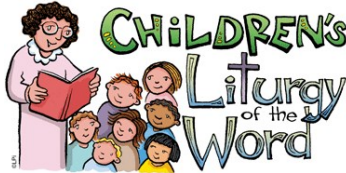

In Fr David's Absence

REFLECTION by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel sees Jesus returning to his home town of Nazareth. He is well and truly into his public ministry at this point in the gospel and his reputation is obviously growing as a healer and teacher. When he goes to Nazareth the locals are quick to 'put him in his place'. They remember the boy, the teenager, the young man apprenticed to his father's craft. He's a nobody as far as they are concerned; just young Yeshua (Jesus) who grew up here.

It is much the same within families and local communities today. No matter how successful and authoritative a young woman or man may have become, a trip home will quickly remind them that in the eyes of those they grew up with nothing has changed. In the gospel passage they even say, that's Jesus – he's just James' brother; no one special! Why would they think they had anything to learn from a brat who grew up in their own town? What could he possibly tell them? They try to force Jesus back into the mould of the person with whom they were previously familiar and comfortable.

We do this to one another all the time. We have certain expectations about the way a friend normally acts or thinks and when they behave differently we react in a way that lets them know that they are not 'being themselves'. In doing this, we are looking to maintain our own comfort zone. We take away the freedom of the other person to grow and change. Many people seem to enter into relationships thinking that neither of them will ever change. This, of course, is an unsustainable assumption. Surely, if we want the best for those we love and care for, we want them to be constantly growing and becoming all that they can be?

The final sentence of today's gospel tells us that Jesus was amazed at the lack of faith displayed by his home town. It is a feature of the Gospel of Mark that the accomplishment of miracles is associated with the faith of those involved. The section of the gospel that surrounds this passage deals with the lack of faith and understanding displayed by the disciples. The home town experience is a lesson to the disciples that in the absence of faith, the ministry of Jesus and those who follow him will falter.

Only those who truly believe can participate in this ministry and share in the miraculous works of Jesus.

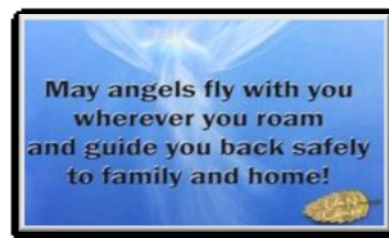
Practical Arrangements whilst Fr David is on Sabbatical

Pope Francis appoints Bishop Comensoli to Melbourne Archdiocese

June 29, 2018

Pope Francis has this evening appointed the Bishop of Broken Bay, Peter A. Comensoli, as the new Archbishop of Melbourne, with effect from August 1, when he will be installed in St Patrick's Cathedral.

Archbishop-elect Comensoli was ordained priest for the Diocese of Wollongong and served as Auxiliary Bishop and Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese of Sydney before being appointed to Broken Bay in December 2014.

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference president Archbishop Mark Coleridge said Archbishop-elect Comensoli has the gifts and energies that his new mission will require.

"Archbishop-elect Peter has a good mind, an engaging personality and the strong pastoral sense needed in our largest diocese at a complex time like this," Archbishop Coleridge said.

"He's a man who can listen and a man who can speak not only to Catholic people, but to the wider community as well."

Archbishop-elect Comensoli grew up in the Illawarra region of New South Wales and was educated by the Good Samaritan Sisters and Marist Fathers before studying commerce at the University of Wollongong and working for a time in the banking sector.

He entered the seminary in 1986 and was ordained in 1992. After ordination, he undertook postgraduate studies in moral theology in Rome and at the University of St Andrews in Scotland.

Archbishop-elect Comensoli said he was humbled that Pope Francis had appointed him Archbishop of Melbourne and recognises "the challenge he has placed before me to lead God's people in Melbourne tenderly, mercifully and joyfully".

"The life of Christian discipleship is a precious gift, developed through hearing and responding to God's call," Archbishop-elect Comensoli said. "In accepting this call to be a new missionary among God's people of the Archdiocese of Melbourne, I readily acknowledge the great responsibility entrusted to me, along with the frailties I carry."

Archbishop-elect Comensoli currently serves on the Bishops Commissions for Evangelisation and for Family, Youth and Life. He has particular responsibility for euthanasia, life matters and media. He recently published a book entitled *In God's Image: Recognizing the Profoundly Impaired as Persons* and has written several articles on Christian anthropology and disability.

In announcing the appointment, Pope Francis also accepted Archbishop Denis Hart's resignation after 17 years as Archbishop of Melbourne. Archbishop Hart will serve as Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese until the installation of the new Archbishop.

Archbishop Hart said Archbishop-elect Comensoli is "generous, gifted and faith-filled and brings a wealth of experience in three dioceses", adding that he and the faithful of Melbourne would welcome the new Archbishop "with warm hearts and strong hope for the future".

Archbishop-elect Comensoli said he was deeply grateful for Archbishop Hart's "faithful leadership and strength of Christian character" and wished him "every blessing" in his retirement.

Broken Bay Bishop Peter A Comensoli DD Announced as Ninth Archbishop for Melbourne

Most Rev Peter A Comensoli, until now the Bishop of the Diocese of Broken Bay, in northern Sydney and the Central Coast of NSW, has today been appointed by Pope Francis as the ninth Archbishop of Melbourne.

"I am delighted at the news of Archbishop-elect Peter Comensoli's appointment," says Archbishop Denis Hart, retiring Archbishop of Melbourne.

"A deeply pastoral and faith-filled man, he will bring many gifts to serve our people. I join the Catholic community in the Archdiocese of Melbourne in our prayerful and heartfelt welcome to him."

Archbishop-elect Comensoli said he was deeply moved by the Holy Father's trust in making this appointment.

"The life of Christian discipleship is a precious gift, developed through hearing and responding to God's call. In accepting this call to be a missionary among God's People of the Archdiocese of Melbourne, I readily acknowledge the great responsibility entrusted to me, along with the frailties I carry.

"To the good people of Melbourne, let me say that you are already in my prayers. As I come among you I place my trust in the tender encouragement of Jesus, through his Blessed Mother. We are pilgrims together in the Lord's vineyard. As we take these first steps in friendship, may we anchor our lives to his Gospel.

"I am deeply aware of the painful witness you bear because of the crimes committed in the Church against the most innocent, our children and the vulnerable. I share the bewilderment and anger you feel at the failure of Church leaders to believe victims and to respond to them with justice and compassion. This is not the way of Jesus Christ. It is our solemn shared duty to right the grievous wrongs of the past and ensure that the future is very different. I pledge myself without reserve to that task, and I ask you to join me in building on the work already underway in the Archdiocese to create safe communities of faith, where trust is earned and care is offered.

"Having been appointed by Pope Francis, I recognise the challenge he has placed before me to lead God's people in Melbourne tenderly, mercifully and joyfully. As a shepherd after the heart of Jesus, the Lord expects me to reach out to all with a Gospel boldness. Therefore, I place my stewardship of the Archdiocese of Melbourne under the intercession of Ss Peter and Paul, on whose feast day this announcement is made."

Born and educated in the Illawarra region of NSW, the Archbishop-elect served in the Wollongong Diocese in a number of parishes and was Diocesan Chancellor for six years prior to his appointment as Auxiliary Bishop to the Archdiocese of Sydney in 2011, and as Apostolic Administrator to the Archdiocese in 2014. Archbishop-elect Comensoli will now lead the Archdiocese of Melbourne after serving as the Bishop of Broken Bay over the past three and a half years.

"I will miss tremendously the wonderful people – laity, religious and clergy – of Broken Bay. For the all too brief time that it has been my privilege to serve them, I am proud to have been their friend and shepherd. Now I look forward to getting to know the people of Melbourne. And as a northerner, I will need some guidance around that mysterious code of football called AFL!

"I extend my deep gratitude to Archbishop Hart for his faithful leadership and strength of Christian character over the past 17 years. His welcome to me has been warm, generous and encouraging, and I wish him every blessing in his retirement."

At a national level, Archbishop-elect Comensoli is currently a member of the Bishops' Commission for Family, Youth and Life, and for Evangelisation. From November 2018 he will take up the appointment of Chair of the Bishops' Commission for Life, Family and Public Engagement, and membership of the Bishops' Commission for the Plenary Council. Archbishop-elect Comensoli will take up stewardship of the Archdiocese on 1 August 2018, at 7pm, during a Solemn Mass and Reception at St Patrick's Cathedral, Melbourne.

The recent outing for the group was to visit the Maritime Museum at Darling Harbour. Our excursion commenced when we met at Gordon station and after boarding a train we went to Central and then took the light rail to Pyrmont. After obtaining our entry tickets we went on a conducted tour of the Museum Workshops where we saw several different types of boats including the Gretel which won the America's Cup some years ago.



There also was a chance to see volunteers making models of boats and working on various projects associated with displays in the Museum. Prior to this tour we viewed the Welcome Wall which displayed the names of new citizens to Australia.

The next tour was to board the Tall Ship the James Craig, a sailing vessel built in the early twentieth century to carry cargo to various parts of the world. The group then went for lunch and after lunch we visited the video and photographic display in the Museum which showed images of the Titanic which were taken using a specially built submarine.

The exhibition of underwater photography showed all sorts of sea creatures including crabs, sea horses, whales, sharks and various varieties of fish.
