Food Pantry

A further opportunity to assist those who are struggling in our area is now being offered. There is a community pantry set up in the front garden of Fusion. It is stocked by those who can spare some extra groceries and toiletries and these are then available to anyone who is in need. The pantry is often empty on the weekends and there is no meal service on Saturday or Sunday at Fusion.

We have offered to stock the pantry once a week on Saturday or Sunday. It is not very large and would be filled by 8-10 pantry items or toiletry supplies. Useful items are cans of soup, noodles, rice, muesli bars, biscuits, cereal and soap, deodorant, tooth paste etc.

Attached is a link to a sign up sheet if you would like to help. The goods can easily be dropped up to Fusion anytime over the weekend and placed in the small pantry out the front.

From Fr David

Dear friends,

Discussion about the use of masks has now become more prevalent, and during the week the NSW Government indicated strong encouragement for the use of face masks in a number of contexts, including churches. Taking this advice seriously, it is important that we now move to using face masks at Mass in the Church. It may feel a little strange at first to do so, but I am confident that in a very short time we will accept it as the norm.

We do not know how long the pandemic will last but we have to be prepared that we will be living with these circumstances at the very least for another twelve months. Remember all of our actions are about keeping one another safe, and also ensuring that our church can remain open. As we have seen now a number of churches have had to close again because of an outbreak of the coronavirus. Let's all work together to prevent this occurring in our own situation.

This Saturday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. It is a most important celebration in our liturgical year. It highlights the promise and the possibility that is given to each of us as sons and daughters of God in Christ Jesus. The power of his Resurrection is active. It was demonstrably active in the life of Mary. And it is also present in our own. In every act of self-sacrifice and thoughtfulness from others we move from the death of selfishness into the life of a life lived in love. This movement from death to life has occurred in all its fullness in Mary, the mother of Jesus. If it has happened in one of us, Mary—it is also available to each and every one of us, and therefore the Assumption of Mary celebrates the hope that arises from our faith We will celebrate the Vigil of the Feast on Friday 14 August at 8.00pm and the day on Saturday 15 August at 9.00am
