105 years ago at Fatima – on Oct. 13, 1917 – Our Lady urged the three shepherd children to pray the rosary every day. She called herself the Lady of the Rosary and urged the children to "continue to say the five decades of the rosary every day... to obtain peace in the world."

While it may be easy to excuse ourselves for not praying the rosary because it is too time consuming or we are too easily distracted by the stresses of modern day living, let us remember that Mary, our mother, has asked us to pray the rosary daily. This is a source of great grace and blessing. We pray the rosary after the 9.15am Tuesday-Friday, and after Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

What does the Word of God say to us today - Year C Week 28?

First reading (2 Kings 5:14-17). On being cured of leprosy, Naaman comes to believe in the true God, and is lavish in his gratitude towards the prophet Elisha.

Second reading (2 Timothy 2:8-13). Paul tells Timothy that the work of preaching the Gospel will result in hardship, opposition and persecution.

Gospel (Luke 17:11-19). The story of ten people who were cured of leprosy by Jesus, and how only one came back to thank him.

The First Reading tells how, on being cured of leprosy, Naaman acknowledges Yahweh as the supreme and only God. However, when he tries to express his gratitude to Elisha, the prophet refuses to accept it, because it would suggest that the cure was due to him rather than to God. As commander of the Syrian army, Naaman was a Gentile.

This story prepares us for the Gospel account of the cure of ten lepers by Jesus, and of how only one of them, a foreigner (a Samaritan), came back to thank him. The stranger puts the Jews to shame. His reaction anticipates the glad reception of the Good News by the Samaritans in Acts 8:1-25. Today's readings remind us of the place of gratitude to God in our life of faith.

Some quotes to help us reflect on the importance of Gratitude in the spiritual life

Introduction: Gratitude is one of the most underrated virtues. It's so often misconstrued as false enthusiasm, naivety or newage positivity. If we concentrate only on what is negative in our lives, we forget the fact that our lives are not ours; they are a gift from God. The response to the greatest gift ever is to give thanks for what we have! Gratitude to God can transform any situation we are in.

Gratitude is essential to growing in our faith life. The Mass is a prayer of Thanksgiving to the Lord. The Eucharist is "a sacrifice of Thanksgiving". Gratitude is at the heart of who we are as Catholics. May today's readings encourage us to maintain a grateful heart.
