Preparing for your Community Consultation Forum

Checklist for your Community Consultation

- **Table Facilitator** (See notes Appendix 3) to lead each small group listening and dialogue conversation at each table
- **Table Scribe** (see notes Appendix 4) to work with the small group to complete the **Small Group Conversation Summary** report.
- Hospitality team
- Small team to consolidate small group notes and synthesise at the service of shaping a Pastoral Discernment Submission

BEFORE the Community Consultation Forum

- Speak with your Community Leader (Parish Priest, Principal, CatholicCare Leader, etc) to plan the consultation phase for your community.
- Decide what groups you will need to invite to be part of your community consultation.
- Plan your communication strategy. Consider **which platforms** i.e. social media, bulletin notices, newsletter announcements, Compass notifications, short videos and **how often**.
- Invite the community by publicising the invitation at Masses, school assemblies, morning teas, in your bulletin, school newsletters, on Compass, and by asking all parishioners, school community, CatholicCare service community members, young people, and others. Be sure to invite those who do not regularly attend Mass. This consultation journey is for everyone and an opportunity for evangelisation.
- Identify a skilled **Table Facilitator** and a **Table Scribe** for each small group.
- Identify someone or small team within your community to collate the notes from each small group into one parish/school/community summary report which will form the basis of your Pastoral Discernment Submission

DURING the Community Consultation Forum

- Provide hospitality such as food and greeters to create a welcoming environment for all who come.
- Bring nametags to encourage conversation, especially for those who are new.
- Ask participants to sign-in, collecting participant name, email, and if they are interested in learning more about the parish/school/CatholicCare services community.
- Gather participants in small groups of 5-6 people so that everyone has an opportunity to share and to listen.
- If you have multiple small groups, you may also encourage the small groups to share with the whole group after they discuss.

AFTER the Community Consultation Forum

- Follow up with the participants. Since the goal of the listening and dialogue session is to consider how the community can continue to invite the participants into deeper participation and leadership in the life of the parish, send an email thanking them for their engagement and participation.
- Consider asking parishioners to follow up with them one-on-one to encourage their involvement in your parish/school/community. (See follow up letter template on page 7).

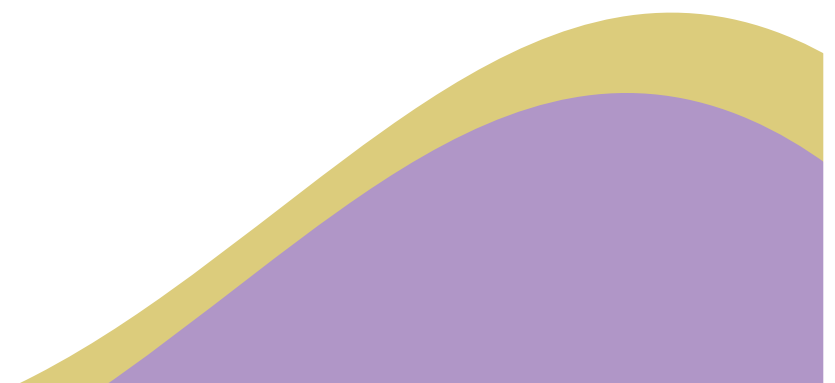

Conversation in The Spirit

A Dynamic of Discernment in the Synodal Church



**SILENCE, PRAYER AND LISTENING
TO THE WORD OF GOD**

TAKING THE WORD AND LISTENING

In small groups of 6-8 people, each person takes turns speaking from his or her own experience and prayer. When others are speaking, remember to listen with an open and humble heart.

PERSONAL PREPARATION

By entrusting oneself to the Father, conversing in prayer with the Lord Jesus and listening to the Holy Spirit, each one prepares his or her own contribution to the topic. Read the reflection in advance on your own or together in a small group. How are you feeling after reading the reflection? What are you thinking? What do you desire?

SILENCE AND PRAYER

MAKING SPACE FOR OTHERS AND THE OTHER

From what the others have said, each one shares what has resonated most with him or her or what has aroused the most resistance in him or her, allowing himself or herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit: "What am I hearing the Holy Spirit saying to us?" This time when sharing, do not add anything new to the conversation - just your response to what you have heard already shared.

BUILDING TOGETHER

Together we dialogue on the basis of what emerged earlier in order to discern and gather the fruit of the conversation in the Spirit: to recognise intuitions and convergences; to identify discordances, obstacles and new questions; to allow prophetic voices to emerge. It is important that everyone can feel represented by the outcome of the work. "To what steps is the Holy Spirit calling us together?" Once everyone has shared their ideas for action, identify 2-3 emerging actions which could be taken.



FINAL PRAYER AND THANKSGIVING

APPENDIX 3

Role of the Table Facilitator

- Make everyone at the table feel welcome, explain the methodology of the approach being taken (Conversation in the Spirit), travel with the group and guide them, and allow people to be vulnerable and share their views and opinions.
- Invite everyone at the table to participate in the discussion.
- Keep an eye on time. Redirect if necessary to keep everyone on topic.
- People may choose not to say anything – that's ok – your role as table facilitator is to invite people to speak.
- Create the opportunity to listen to the Holy Spirit.
- Encourage dialogue and listening at the table.
- Create an environment of openness where people feel comfortable in sharing.
- Observe times of silence and prompt and remind those at your table of prayerful silence between rounds. Time for silence in between rounds allows time to listen to any interior movements in one's heart and spirit.
- Be mindful that this process is NOT a place for;
 - Debating, defending or arguing
 - Correcting others,
 - Feeling obliged to teach others, even if well-intended
 - Advancing an agenda
 - A search for the 'one right answer'

APPENDIX 4

Role of the Table Scribe

- **During the three rounds** of Conversation in the Spirit the Table Scribe takes notes of what everyone is saying to use as the collective notes of what was shared amongst the group.
- **Following the three rounds** of Conversation in the Spirit the Table Scribe works with the Table Facilitator, and all those at the table, to synthesise the fruits of the conversation and completes the **SMALL GROUP CONVERSATION SUMMARY** report.
- **At the conclusion of the three rounds** of conversation, time will be allocated for writing the summary report during the session.
- The Table Scribe then submits the **Small Group Conversation Summary** to the Community Consultation Facilitator. The **Consultation Facilitator** will collate and synthesise the responses that have been received from all the small groups into a summary Parish/School/Community report and prepare a Pastoral Discernment Submission for Bishop Anthony's discernment and consideration.
