In Flanders fields.







This weekend marks the launch of the Annual Vinnies Christmas Appeal. The Appeal is for Christmas hampers for our clients in Pymble, Wyong and Glebe, or a cash donation.

Hampers for Pymble and Wyong clients

This year, we will again be requesting food hampers for our clients in **Pymble** and **Wyong**. Please take a numbered card for a recipient family from the back of the Church, which details the adults, number and age of children in the family. Please fill in your details on the sheet provided, and take some boxes.

Members will be available to assist with this. When you return your hamper, please ensure you clearly label it (each box) with this number, so it can go to the correct family. The hampers not only provide some welcome celebration at Christmas but also some staples to help support the family. Suggestions for the hamper include:

- Christmas fare such as Christmas cake, puddings, mince pies, shortbread, nuts, custard and jelly
- Pantry staples such as pasta, rice, pasta sauce, jams and spreads, tinned food (baked beans, tuna etc), noodles, Christmas stockings and sweets for children
- Drinks such as long life milk, tea, coffee, cordial or Milo
- Toiletries such as shampoo and soap
- No alcohol or chocolate please

Gift Cards for Glebe clients

We are offering an alternative option for our clients in **Glebe** this year. Clients in this area are typically single person households. In addition, our members in the area have found it increasingly difficult to lift the hamper boxes and distribute them. We are therefore offering them a small Christmas bag, which will contain the following:

- 3-5 small single serve Christmas fare items (i.e. a cake or pudding serve, ginger bread or sweets)
- Vouchers for Coles \$40 and K-Mart \$20, which can be purchased at the back of the church (receipts can be supplied for tax purposes)
- A card for the client, extending them Christmas wishes
- · Make the bag festive if you wish

Please take a bag and a numbered card, prepare the bag and when you return it, the vouchers will be added to your card and to the bag. Please ensure your card is tied to your bag so it can go to the correct family. This option may suit those who find it hard to manage a heavy box or are time poor.

Small gifts for aged care residents

We also offer small gifts to aged care residents (e.g. soap or handkerchiefs) who do not have any family, to ensure they receive something for Christmas. Numbered cards are also supplied for this at the back of the church. Please return the gift with the card.

Liturgy of the Word Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Entrance Antiphon Psalm 87:3

Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading 1 Kings 17:10-16 A reading from the book of the Kings

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said, 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth.""

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.' He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'.

Gospel Reflection

Meditation: What is true religion and devotion to God? Jesus warns his disciples against the wrong kind of religion. In his denunciation of the scribes (the religious experts of his day), he warns against three things: the desire for prominence and first place of honour rather than lowly service for the benefit of others; the desire for deference and recognition (and seeking esteem from others) rather than seeking to promote the good of others through humble service and selfless care for others; and thirdly, attempting to use one's position (even a religious position) for self-gain and selfadvancement. True religion is relating rightly to God and to one's neighbour with love, honour, and respect. The Lord puts his Holy Spirit within us that we may be filled with the joy of his presence, the joy of true worship, and the joy of selfless giving and love for others. True reverence for God frees the heart to give liberally, both to God and to neighbour.

Jesus taught his disciples a dramatic lesson in sitting in the temple and observing people offering their tithes. Jesus praised a poor widow who gave the smallest of coins in contrast with the rich who gave greater sums. someone who has ample means? Jesus' answer is very simple - love is more precious than gold!

Real giving comes from a heart full of gratitude

Jesus taught that real giving must come from the heart. A gift that is given with a grudge or for display loses most of its value. But a gift given out of love, with a spirit of generosity and sacrifice, is invaluable. The amount or size of the gift doesn't matter as much as the cost to the giver. The poor widow could have kept one of her coins, but instead she recklessly gave away all she had! Jesus praised someone who gave barely a penny - how insignificant a sum - because it was everything she had, her whole living. What we have to offer may look very small and not worth much, but if we put all we have at the Lord's disposal, no matter how insignificant it may seem, then God can do with it and with us what is beyond our reckoning. Do you know the joy and freedom of giving liberally to God and to neighbour with gratitude and love?

Lord Jesus, all that I have is yours. Take my life, my possessions, my time and all that I have and use them as you desire for your glory.






