



#### POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTION FOR JANUARY


FOR THE RIGHT TO AN EDUCATION




This week we pray for the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

# Fr George Kolodziej SDS

On Monday, 6 January 2025, Pope Francis appointed Perth based Fr George Kolodziej SDS as the fifth Bishop of Bunbury succeeding Bishop Gerard Holohan in the role. Bishop Holohan led the diocese for 22 years until his retirement at the age of 75.

Fr George, 56, was born in Dobra, southern Poland, and has been the Superior of the Salvatorians in Australia since October 2018. He directs the Salvatorian Spirituality Centre in Perth and is a member of the Council of Catholic Religious Australia and the Council of Priests of the Archdiocese of Perth. He has served as a chaplain for Catholic Education Western Australia since January 2019.

Fr George has served in multiple roles in the Broken Bay Diocese, including as assistant priest in the Pymble Parish from 2001 to 2003.

Our congratulations to Fr George and our best wishes to him in his new role leading the Bunbury Diocese.



#### A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The nations then will see your integrity, all the kings your glory, and you will be called by a new name, one which the mouth of the Lord will confer. You are to be a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord,

a princely diadem in the hand of your God; no longer are you to be named 'Forsaken', nor your land 'Abandoned', but you shall be called 'My Delight' and your land 'The Wedded', for the Lord takes delight in you and your land will have its wedding. Like a young man marrying virgin, so will the one who built you wed you, and as the bridegroom rejoice in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 12: 4-11

## A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift

of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Gospel Acclamation 2 Thessalonians 2: 14

Alleluia, alleluia! God has called us with the gospel to share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Gospel John 2: 1-11

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

#### **Gospel Reflection**

Meditation: Do you recognize the glory and presence of the Lord Jesus in your life? God often reveals his glory to us in the unlikeliest of places - in a cold stable at Bethlehem, at a village wedding party in Cana, on a bloody cross at Golgatha, or on the road to Emmaus. In today's Gospel reading we see the first public sign and miracle which Jesus performed. The Lord Jesus brought great blessing and joy to a newly wed couple and their wedding party. First by his presence, and second by saving them from embarrassment when the wine ran out. Changing water into wine was a remarkable act of kindness; but giving the best to last was unnecessary and unheard of. In the Old Testament wine is seen as both a gift and blessing of God (Deuteronomy 7:13; Proverbs 3:10, Psalm 105:). That Jesus would miraculously

produce 120 gallons of the best wine (man times more than needed) shows th superabundance of the blessings which h came to offer.

This miracle signifies the "new rich wine" o the Gospel and it points to the "wine of th new covenant" and the "bread of life" whic-Jesus provides for his disciples in the Lord' Supper or Eucharist. It also points to th Messianic banquet which Jesus will provide a the end of the age when he comes again in hi glory. The miracles of Jesus demonstrate th power of God's love and mercy for his people God's kindness knows no limits. And th ultimate expression of his love is revealed i the person of his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. H became flesh for our sake, and he died for ou redemption, and he rose that we, too, migh be raised up and glorified with him. Do yo thirst for God and for the abundant life anblessings he offers to you?

Heavenly Father, you have revealed your glory in our Lord Jesus Christ. Fill me with your Holy Spirit that I may bring you glory in all that I do and say.






