
Our first session at Sacred Heart will be at our 9:30am Mass on Sunday, 9 February.

Entrance Antiphon Cf Psalm 94: 6-7

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First Reading

Isaiah 6: 1-8

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings.

And they cried out to one another in this way,

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:

'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said:

See now, this has touched your lips, Your sin is taken away, Your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying:

'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?'

I answered, 'Her I am, send me.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 137: 1-5, 7-8 R.v. 1

(R.) In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.

- I thank you, Lord, with all my heart, you have heard the words of my mouth. Before the angels I will bless you. I will adore before your holy temple. (R.)
- I thank you for your faithfulness and love which excel all we ever knew of you. On the day I called, you answered; you increased the strength of my soul. (R.)
- All earth's kings shall thank you when they hear the words of your mouth. They shall sing of the Lord's ways; 'How great is the glory of the Lord!' (R.)
- You stretch out your hand and save me, your hand will do all things for me. Your love, O Lord, is eternal, discard not the work of your hands. (R.)

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 15: 1-11

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve do nothing without us. The Creator of th the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

Gospel Acclamation Matthew 4:19

Alleluia, alleluia! Come follow me, says the Lord, and I will make you fishers of my people. Alleluia!

Gospel Luke 5: 1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus was standing one day by the lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round says, "But thanks be to God, who in Chris him listening to the word of God, when he Jesus always leads us in triumph, and throug caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats - it was Simon's - and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help To access Fr Irek's homily on them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knee of Jesus saying, 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinfu man.' For he and all his companions wer completely overcome by the catch they have made; so also were James and John, son of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. Bu Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringin their boats back to land, they left everythin and followed him.

Gospel Reflection

God expects greater things than we can do b ourselves

This incident tells us an important truth abou how God works in and through each of us fo his glory. God expects of us greater thing than we can do by ourselves. When w cooperate in his works, we accomplish fa beyond what we can do on our own. Theres of Lisieux, a Carmelite nun who died o tuberculosis at the age of twenty-four, wrot to a friend: "Jesus has so incomprehensible love for us that he wills that we have a shar with him in the salvation of souls. He wills to universe awaits the prayer of a poor little soc to save other souls redeemed like it at th price of all his Blood."

When God's word is spoken his kingdom i revealed and his power is released. Whe people respond to God's word with faith anobedience they are changed and made "a nev creation" in Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Witness the joy of the Gospel

God chooses ordinary people, like you and me as his ambassadors and he uses the ordinar circumstances of our daily lives and wor situations to draw others into his kingdom Jesus speaks the same message to us today we will "catch people" for the kingdom of Goif we allow the light of Jesus Christ to shin through us. God wants others to see the ligh of Christ in us in the way we live, speak, anwitness the joy of the Gospel. Paul the Apostl us spreads the fragrance of the knowledge o him everywhere. For we are the aroma c Christ to God among those who are bein saved and among those who are perishing" (Corinthians 2:15).

Do you witness to those around you the joy o the Gospel and do you pray for you neighbours, co-workers, and relatives tha they may come to know the Lord Jesus Chris and grow in the knowledge of his love and
