



Religious Education in 1M at Sacred Heart



For the Year 1 students at Sacred Heart Catholic School, the Religious Education lessons are our favourite part of the school day. We are lucky enough to have a special Religious Education room that we visit when we are learning about Jesus, or special feast days or when we are learning about the Sacraments or significant moments during Mass.



Each lesson after our teacher presents an important story or explains about a special liturgical action we explore the stories using drama, the arts, writing and prayer. We also have



The St Vincent de Paul Winter Appeal is a cornerstone of the annual fundraising activities undertaken by the Society. This activity ensures that we are able to respond to the demand present in the community through our wide range

of programs and specialised services. As housing security becomes more precarious due to rising rents, cost-of-living pressures and a shortage of affordable housing, our services are hearing daily from people who in years gone by would never have needed to seek support. These are people who hold jobs that should offer stability, yet are sleeping in cars, tents or relying on the goodwill of others.

This demand is being seen daily by our members. Two years ago, 19% of people seeking assistance from our NSW members were experiencing homelessness or living in temporary accommodation. Today that figure has risen concerningly to 30%. As the pressures faced by the working homeless, and other vulnerable people in our community, intensify it is vital that the Society is able to offer support to those in their time of need.

Pymble St Vincent de Paul Conference extends thanks to our whole parish community for your generous and kind support which enables us to help people and families in our community who need a hand up.

Meals are always needed. Can you help? If you would like to help by contributing some of your skills in preparing meals or to provide transport for the meals then please contact the Parish office.







Liturgy of the Word The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Entrance Antiphon Psalm 32: 11, 19

The designs of his Heart are from age to age, to rescue their souls from death, and to keep them alive in famine.

First Reading Hose 11: 1, 3-4, 8-9 A reading from the prophet Hosea

Listen to the word of the Lord:

When Israel was a child I loved him, and I called my son out of Egypt. I myself taught Ephraim to walk, I took them in my arms; yet they have not understood that I was the one looking after them. I led them with reins of kindness, with leading-strings of love. I was like someone who lifts an infant close

against his cheek; stooping down to him I gave him his food. How could I treat you like Admah, or deal with you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils from it, My whole being trembles at the thought. I will not give rein to my fierce anger, I will not destroy Ephraim again, for I am God, not man: I am the Hoy One in your midst and have no wish to destroy.

It was Preparation Day, and to prevent the bodies remaining on the cross during the sabbath – since that sabbath was a day of special solemnity – the Jews asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken away. Consequently the soldiers came and kingdom was far different from any of the broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with him and then of the other. When they came to Jesus, they found he was already dead, and so instead of breaking his legs one of the soldiers pierced his side with a lance; and immediately there came out blood and water. This is the evidence of one who saw it – trustworthy evidence, and he knows he speaks the truth – and he gives it so that you may believe as well. Because all this happened to fulfil the words of scripture:

Not one bone of his will the broken;

And again, in another place scripture says:

They will look on the one whom they have pierced.

Gospel Reflection

Meditation: What kind of ruler does the world need today? Who can establish true peace and justice for all? When the people of Israel settled into the promised land, they wanted a king to unite and rule them like the other nations around them. Their first king, Saul, failed to

for Christ or the Anointed One) was the Son of David. The Jews looked forward to the longexpected Savior who would come from the line of David. Jesus was often addressed with

Jesus, the Anointed King and Ruler of All, fulfils the promise God made with David

Why did Jesus question the Jews on the claim that their Messiah or Christ would be the son of David? After all the New Testament makes clear that Jesus himself is a direct descendant from the line of David's throne (Romans 1:3, 2 Timothy 2:8, Matthew 1:1-17, Luke 3:23-38). Jesus posed the question to make his hearers understand that the Messiah is more than the son of David. Jesus makes his point in dramatic fashion by quoting from one of David's prophetic psalms, Psalm 110:The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, till I put your enemies under your feet. How can the son be the lord of his father? Jesus, who took upon himself our human nature for our sake, is not only the son of David, he is first and foremost the Son of God eternally begotten of the Father. The Messiah King whom God promised to send would not only come from David's line, but would be greater than any earthy ruler who came before or would come after.

Jesus claimed a sovereignty that only God can claim - a sovereignty that extends not only to the ends of the earth but to the heavens as well. But the way Jesus would establish his expectations of the tiny nation of Israel. Jesus came to rule hearts and minds, not lands and entitlements. He came to free people from the worst tyranny possible - slavery to sin, Satan, and a world ruled by greed and lust for power and wealth.

Jesus, risen in glory by the power of the Holy Spirit, now reigns as Lord over all of creation

Paul the Apostle states that no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:3). It is the role of the Holy Spirit to make the Lord Jesus present and known in our lives. We can accept the Lord Jesus or reject him, love him or ignore him. He will not force his rule upon us. But the consequences of our choice will not only shape our present life but our destiny as well.


