Reflection

Pastoral Works Broken Bay



This weekend (4th & 5th May) and next weekend (11th & 12th May) the parish will be having our 1st appeal for Pastoral Works Broken Bay (PWBB). The Appeal supports two key Diocesan ministries which get little or no government funding. They are:

• The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) – around 711 volunteer catechists taking the Gospel to approximately 12,000 public school children across our

Diocese. CCD provides a large range of online resources for the students plus newsletters, training, and workshops for the volunteers. and

 Hospital Chaplaincy & Pastoral Care Program – Chaplains and care practitioners visit more than 3,000 individual hospital patients each year from seven hospitals in our Diocese.

Pastoral Works Broken Bay also supports:

- St Lucy's School and St Edmond's College – serving students with disabilities, and
- The Ephpheta Centre which provides support and advocacy for the deaf community.

Your support and generosity are vitally important. It has made a huge difference in the past to many people. All donations over \$2 are tax deductible.

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some day.
