Reflection on Gospel

In this passage, Jesus faces opposition from His family and accusations from the scribes that He is possessed by Beelzebul. Jesus refutes these claims by explaining that a kingdom divided against itself cannot stand and emphasizes that His power over demons comes from the Holy Spirit. Jesus also redefines family, stating that those who do the will of God are His true family. This challenges us to reflect on our own relationship with Jesus and to understand that spiritual kinship with Christ transcends biological ties.

Second Reading St Paul to the Corinthians 4:13-5:1

We believe, and therefore we speak.

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture—I believe, and therefore I spoke—we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weight little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

Gospel Mark 30:20-35

It is the end of Satan.

Jesus went home with his disciple, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him,' and 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either-it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brother now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him a the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brother and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'
