Affordable rentals and housing is not available for very low and low income individuals and families on the Central Coast. This is causing couch surfing, multi families sharing small spaces, youth becoming rough sleepers. The State government gave \$1 Billion to Sydney for rough sleepers, and a large grant for social housing for the Cessnock area. Our % of homeless is more than the Greater Sydney area. We are getting nothing.

The Solution: substantial growth of Social Housing implemented by the local council and the State Government.
