Reflection

Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the conclusion of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. This Feast celebrates Jesus' transition from His hidden life to His public ministry and serves as a manifestation of His divinity, echoing the theme of the Epiphany.

Although Jesus had no need for repentance, He chose to be baptized by John. This act affirmed John's prophetic mission and marked a bridge between the Old Testament and the New Era of grace. Through His Baptism, Jesus sanctified the waters, making them a source of salvation. The event was also an epiphany, revealing His divine sonship as the Holy Spirit descended and the Father declared, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

As we enter Ordinary Time, reflect on these words of the Father. Let them inspire you to follow Jesus more closely and embrace His mission of drawing us to the Father.

First Reading Prophet Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

The glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it.

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Second Reading St Paul to Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7

He saved us through the water of rebirth and renewal in the Holy Spirit.
