Reflection

This passage highlights the communal nature of discipleship, emphasizing the importance of mutual support. It also teaches us to trust in God and the generosity of others, fostering humility and deeper faith. Facing resistance is part of discipleship, just as Jesus and John the Baptist did. We are called to face challenges with courage, knowing Christ is with us.

In our own discipleship, we should support one another, trust in God's provision, boldly proclaim the Gospel, and face resistance with faith and courage. Let us pray for the grace to be faithful disciples, following the Apostles' example.

Second Reading St Paul to the Ephesians 1:3-14

Before the world was made, he chose us in Christ.

Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Christ Jesus, for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved, in whom through his blood, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of sins.

Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight.

Mark 6:7-13

He called the Twelve, and began to send them out.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.'
