Reflection on Gospel

In the **First Reading**, God uses the image of a small shoot growing into a majestic cedar to show His power to transform and provide refuge.

In the **Second Reading**, Paul urges us to live by faith, aiming to please God, with the awareness of our eternal home.

The **Gospel** features two parables. The growing seed parable illustrates the mysterious and divine growth of God's kingdom, beyond our understanding. The mustard seed parable highlights the kingdom's humble beginnings and its potential for great transformation.

These readings call us to trust in God's timing, knowing He can bring great growth from small beginnings. We are encouraged to sow seeds of kindness, love, and faith, trusting God to nurture them. Our small contributions can yield abundant fruit. Let us live by faith, contribute to God's kingdom, and find solace in our eternal home with Him.

First Reading Ezekiel 17:22-24

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this:

'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar.

Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches. And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and make the withered green. Second Reading St Paul to the Corinthians 5:6-10

Whether we are living in the body or exile from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exile from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight—we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel Mark 4:26-34

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowds: 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them expect in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
