Today's readings are full of hope, encouraging us to reflect on faith and transformation, and to trust in God's promises. As Lent

continues, we try to spend extra time in prayer, giving ourselves more opportunity to recognise the presence and action of God in our lives. In Luke's **Gospel of the Transfiguration**, Jesus takes Peter, James and John up the mountain to pray. In the presence of Moses and Elijah, they see a glimpse of Jesus's true identity: his divinity is revealed. A voice from the cloud confirms Jesus as God's Son, and commands us: 'Listen to him!'





Second Sunday of Lent, Year C

First Reading Book of Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?'
