Reflection on Gospel



Worries and concerns are part of human life. Jesus teaches us, however, that

we ought not to let worries and concerns consume us. Jesus teaches us that our faith ought to lead us to trust in God's protection and love, no matter how strong the whirlwind going on around us. Like the disciples, we can bring our worries and concerns to Jesus in prayer. Jesus will hear our cries for help. He knows that our faith can be fragile and he will act so that our trust in God will be strengthened.

As you gather as a family, invite family members to talk about something that might be worrying them. Talk about how important it is to share worries and concerns with people. When we do this, we learn to see our worries from a different perspective. Ask your family questions such as these: Why were the disciples worried about the storm? Why wasn't Jesus worried about the storm? When we bring our worries to Jesus in prayer, Jesus can help us see things from God's perspective. Invite family members to name again a worry or concern and pray together that Jesus will help us have faith in God's love and protection. Conclude in prayer together by praying the Lord's Prayer.

Wills, Enduring Guardianship and Powers of Attorney Seminar

The Diocese of Broken Bay and Castle Lawyers will be holding a free seminar and morning tea on Tuesday 20th August at Epping Club (45-47 Rawson St, Epping) from 10:30am to 12:30pm. This event is designed to provide valuable information about the importance of Wills, Enduring Guardianship and Powers of Attorney. The Seminar will be presented by Cecilia Castle from Castle Lawyers.

Terms and Conditions for the Wills Seminar; Those registered for the event will be able to engage Castle Lawyers to draft, at no cost, one of the following; Standard Will; or Enduring Powers of Attorney; or Enduring Guardianship document.

To be eligible for the offer, the following terms and conditions apply.

- 1. The participant must make a donation of at least \$250 to the Pastoral Works Broken Bay fund prior to making the appointment with Castle Lawyers. Donation an be made by credit card at www.bbcatholic.org.au/giving/pastoral-works-broken-bay/pastoralworks. Please retain your receipt as evidence of your donation. OR
- 2. For Standard Wills only, make a bequest to the Catholic Parish of the Diocese of Broken Bay in your Will prepared by Castle Lawyers. This may include a specific dollar amount greater than \$1,000, a percentage of the estate, a residual of the estate or the entire estate.
- 3. The offer is limited to one standard will, Power of Attorney or Enduring Guardianship document per attendee. Additional fees will be payable for complex documentation.
- 4. Documents must be finalized by 30th September 2024.
- 5. The offer is subject to available appointments.
- 6. There is no obligation to take up the above offer. You are still most welcome to attend the seminar.
