Reflection

Jesus - the Light of the World

We continue our Christmas celebration with the Feast of the Epiphany, a word meaning "revelation." Jesus is revealed to the nations of the world as their Saviour too, not just the people of Israel. The nations are represented by the Magi, people from another land, another language, another culture, another time and place. They follow the light of a star to find the Light of the World, and there they give him their worship. And to honour their Saviour, they bring gifts that are expensive, precious, and rare. Gold—the traditional gift of a subject honouring their King, Frankincense—the sweet smelling perfume used in worship services (Jesus is more than an earthy king) and Myrrh, the bitter smelling scent used to embalm the dead—a reminder of the suffering that this King will endure.

Word that these visitors from the East are seeking a newly born king of Judeans strikes fear into the heart of old Herod who

Alleluia, alleluia!

is the current, living king of Judeans. He knows that he has no newly born heir. Matthew draws a contrast between these honourable visitors from the east and the fearful rule of Herod. Let us treasure the gift of our faith and not betray our relationship with Christ.

First Reading Prophet Isaiah 60:1-6

The glory of the Lord shines upon you.

Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

We have come from the East to worship the King.

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way. The Gospel of the Lord.
