Pope Francis' Message of Hope



Hope, which is more than mere optimism, gives one a deep-rooted confidence in the love and care of God, no matter what has happened, Pope Francis said last Sunday.

Hope "does not expire, because it is based on the fidelity of God. The hope of the Spirit is not even optimism. Born deeper, it rekindles at the bottom of the heart the certainty of being precious because loved," the Pope said June 16.

"It is a hope that leaves peace and joy inside, regardless of what happens outside. It is a hope that has strong roots, which no storm of life can uproot," he added.

The truth, Pope Francis said, is that "God remembers us as we are, with our frailties." "No one is contemptible in his eyes, each has an infinite value for him: we are small under heaven and powerless when the earth trembles, but for God we are more precious than anything."

"I pray to the God of hope, so that what is unstable on earth does not shake the certainty we have inside."

God remembers everyone and he can heal the memories of that difficult time, he said. "God helps us to be builders of good, consolers of hearts. Everyone can do a little good, without waiting for others to start."


