## Gospel


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke  
Luke 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour.

He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour.

A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesies by inviting you in return. 

## Twenty Second Sunday Ordinary Time Yr C 1st September 2019



The importance of Father's day is that it should become a day of recognising and being thankful for the important role a father plays in the life of a family. Indeed, fathers do play a significant role in the family. Children need a father in their lives. The late Pope John Paul II in his Apostolic Exhortation "Redemptoris Custos" (Guardian of the Redeemer) on 15 August 1989, asked the faithful to reflect on and understand the role of fatherhood in relation to the person of St Joseph, the husband of Mary. We call Mary "Mother of the Church" for she was the mother of Jesus, and at the foot of the cross, Jesus entrusts his disciples to her care (John 19:26). In the same way we look to St. Joseph as "Patron and Protector of the Universal Church" and in doing so, we recognize and honour his fatherly role of protector of the "Holy Family."

As a Church, we uphold St. Joseph as the model for husbands and fathers. From what we know from the gospels, St Joseph faced major dilemmas in his life just like any other father. He was a person who listened to, and was aware of, his "inner calling". It happened because apart from being a just man, he had other "grounding" qualities like faith, humility and loving care. We can all learn from St Joseph's discerning attitude when dealing with our own families' dilemmas and issues.

And while dealing with those issues, if we discern that what we choose, is in line with God's will for us, then we can certainly trust that the outcome will bring joy and peace not only to us but to our whole family as well.

We see these qualities in our fathers. Today, we as a community thank God for the gifts of our fathers and we pray that God may give them the wisdom to carry out their role of guiding and protecting our families. (Extract of Fr.Alo's reflection).

### St Brigid's College Lake Munmorah

The College is seeking Supervisors for the upcoming HSC Written Examinations from Thursday 17th October to 11th November, to work with the Presiding Officer to supervise students during the examination, to ensure they are adhering to the examination code of conduct. Supervisors will need to have a Working With Children Check and be physically able to stand for long periods. Supervisors are paid between \$23.81 and \$27.12 hourly, depending on the number of students they are supervising. A person CANNOT be a supervisor if they have a child or near relative (including siblings, grandparents, nieces, nephews or first cousins) sitting the HSC examinations at the same exam centre, or if they work at the school in a paid capacity, or they volunteer at the school or tutor students sitting the HSC examinations from St Brigid's if you are eligible and able to assist, even for a day, please email [stbrigids@dbb.catholic.edu.au](mailto:stbrigids@dbb.catholic.edu.au) to let us know of the days/dates you would be able to help.
