A reading from the letter of St Paul to Philemon Phil 1: 9-10, 12-17

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother;

especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.



Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.' Death through Eve, Life through Mary- St. Jerome

On 8th September we celebrate the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the most holy person, in history apart from Jesus, to walk upon this earth. What evil Eve did, Mother Mary undid; Eve brought sin and death into the world, but Mary brought Holiness and life into this word.

Pious parents beget holy children. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the fruit of fervent prayers and holiness of her parents - St. Joachim and St. Anna. They were upright people, fearing God and following all His commandments and ordinances. They were afflicted, yet they remained faithful to God; they were despised by others, yet they loved their neighbours and helped them in their need.

They placed their trust in God, even when they were living in great disgrace and affliction. When God gave the Blessed Virgin Mary as a gracious gift to St. Joachim and St. Anna, they offered her back to God as a glorious gift. The birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary was a blessing not only to her parents, for she took away their disgrace of being childless, but, also, to the whole world, for through her the Redeemer of the world was born into the world.

St. Jerome, the great Scripture scholar, had noted that the word Mary, or Miriam, is derived from the Hebrew word 'Yam' which means 'sea'. Mother Mary is a precious 'drop' from the Sea which is God. She partakes of the graciousness, gentleness and loveliness, although in a minuscule way, of the nature of God. She is a spark of God.

It is good to know that the Church solemnizes only three birthdays, namely, those of Christ, of holy Mary and of John the Baptist.

These three birthdays mark three spiritual births, for we are reborn in water with John, in penance with Mary and in glory with Christ.
