## **Hostility or Hospitality**



In today's gospel there are two religious attitudes which are in conflict with one another, and that conflict is what is the correct attitude towards sinners.

There are the Scribes and the Pharisees, on the one hand, who complain that Jesus welcomes sinners, and actually eats with them. They're belief is that religious people should separate themselves not only from sin, but also from sinners, and so they're actually advocating segrega-

On the other hand, Jesus takes the direct opposite view, he believes in association and developing relationships. And so, rather than separating himself from sinners he welcomes them and eats with them.

The scribes and Pharisees believe that hostility is the answer. Jesus believes that hospitality is the answer; and so these differing views bring the scribes and the Pharisees on a collision course with Jesus.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus sees his mission as seeking out the company of sinners, moving into their lives; "For the Son of Man has come to seek and save the lost." (Lk 19:10)

The Pharisees, on the other hand, feel obliged to register their complaint about Jesus' pastoral strategy, and while they come to complain about Jesus, the tax collectors and sinners come to hear what Jesus has to say.

And so, these two opposing groups become Jesus' audience, and both groups are represented in the story that Jesus tells.
