

Today's Gospel reminds us, "Faithfulness in a Little is Faithfulness in Much". Jesus' warning is that no one can serve two masters - God and Mammon (in Aramaic, Mammon means 'riches or treasure'), because both do not work together. If we are too much attached to worldly possessions, God takes a back seat and finally God is forgotten. We cannot be faithful and devoted to two masters. So also, with God and Mammon. Hence the message is that the only way we can be trusted with possessions is, if they don't possess us.

All the readings of today emphasize the concept of Justice. Justice is understood as certain situation of mind, whereby a man does what he ought to do in the circumstances confronting him. Justice is primarily concerned with conduct in relation to others, especially with regard to the rights of others. The Gospel is a good reminder to turn away from the self-serving attitudes and to turn towards justice. Jesus speaks loudly and clearly: we cannot serve two masters. The disciple cannot serve God and wealth.

We can clearly see that this parable is addressed to us, we who are still living. One has to be grateful to God for what he has given us and wants to give us in this life. It also invites us to work honestly and be generous with what we have. God will be generous to us and he will care for us in every possible way. "God does not create poverty. We do because we do not share "St. Teresa of Calcutta.
