# Dear Parishioners,

Jesus, often, said that His mission was to go to Jerusalem and die on the cross. Unfortunately, during Jesus' lifetime, no one, not even His disciples understood him properly. They always thought that to be with Jesus was to share in His power and dominion.



In today's gospel, Jesus rebuked John and James, two of his disciples who wished to act in contrary to the mission of Jesus. Jesus, by his action, made it clear that he has come not to destroy people but to save them. His mission was to give life and not to take it away. His purpose was not to be a curse, but a blessing for the people- to heal, cleanse and redeem them. That is why, St. Paul said, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Jesus Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" (Eph. 1: 3).

Jesus Christ, our Lord and Master, is a blessing. He came not to curse us, but to bless us; He came not to hurt us, but to heal us; He came not to condemn us, but to forgive and redeem us.

Those who wish to follow Jesus should also accept the cost of the discipleship. Christian discipleship is a decision to walk in His ways steadily and firmly and be ready to pay the cost. As disciples of Jesus we are called to be a blessing.

#### Genesis to Jesus A Course on Salvation History
