The temptations faced by Jesus in the desert Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel gives detailed account of the temptations of Jesus at the beginning of His public ministry. Jesus spent forty days fasting and praying in the wilderness. After that the devil appeared and tempted Him. The temptations were of three kinds. The first temptation was to change stones into bread. A temptation that He could satisfy His hunger and the hunger of the people around Him. The devil tempted Jesus in a very subtle way and asked Jesus to be a miracle worker who will remove the hunger of the masses. But Jesus firmly rejected this temptation. He sternly told the devil: "Man does not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

The second temptation took place on a high mountain. The devil showed Jesus the glory of the kingdoms of the whole world and promised Him that he would give Him all the glory and power in the world if Jesus worshiped the devil. Jesus rejected this temptation too by telling the devil: "You shall worship the Lord your God." Thus, Jesus affirmed that worship is only for God and worldly possessions, power, positions and all that belongs to the devil are not to be worshiped.

In the third and final temptation, the devil asked Jesus to throw Himself down from the pinnacle of the Jerusalem temple. Jesus was assured that the angels would protect Him from any harm. Jesus rejected this temptation too. It was a temptation to test the power of God. Jesus made it clear to the devil that we have no reason to put God to test in any matter. God is not the cause of man-made disasters, calamities and wars. Lent is a God given time to overcome our many temptations (weaknesses) through fasting and prayer as Jesus did in the desert.

Jesus overcame these temptations through his knowledge of his identity, his purpose, and God's plan for human salvation. Satan will tempt each of us to doubt God's love, providence, and power. Here we are taught to follow Jesus' example and respond to temptation as he did (CCC #2119). Let us also remember that we are not tempted because we are evil; we are tempted because we are human.

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy *The confession of faith of the elect.*
