THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST CONTINUED

The liturgy of the Eucharist unfolds two great parts that form a fundamental unity: - the gathering, the liturgy of the Word, with readings, homily and general intercessions;- the liturgy of the Eucharist, with the presentation of the bread and wine, the consecratory thanksgiving, and communion.

The *presentation of the offerings* (the Offertory) at the altar takes up the gesture of Melchizedek and commits the Creator's gifts into the hands of Christ who, in his sacrifice, brings to perfection all human attempts to offer sacrifices.

The presence of Christ by the power of his word and the Holy Spirit

The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend. The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ. To receive communion is to receive Christ himself who has offered himself for us. "The altar represents the body [of Christ] and the Body of Christ is on the altar."215 The liturgy expresses this unity of sacrifice and communion in many prayers.

The fruits of Holy Communion

Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Holy Communion separates us from sin. The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." The Eucharist preserves us from future mortal sins. The more we share the life of Christ and progress in his friendship, the more difficult it is to break away from him by mortal sin.

The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren.

THE EUCHARIST - "PLEDGE OF THE GLORY TO COME"

Since the Eucharist is the memorial of the Passover of the Lord Jesus, if by our communion at the altar we are filled "with every heavenly blessing and grace," then the Eucharist is also an anticipation of the heavenly glory. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever; . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . abides in me, and I in him" (*Jn* 6:51, 54, 56).

In the diocese a child can receive first holy communion after baptism and confirmation in year 4 or above. The First holy communion concludes the sacraments of initiation. Only validly ordained priests can preside at the Eucharist and consecrate the bread and the wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord. Anyone who desires to receive Christ in Eucharistic communion must be in the state of grace. The Church warmly recommends that the faithful receive Holy Communion when they participate in the celebration of the Eucharist; she obliges them to do so at least once a year.

"One who is to receive the most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion" (CIC 919 §1). Elderly people, those who are ill, and their caretakers are excused from the Eucharistic fast (CIC 191 §3). There is an estimated (at least) 350,000 Catholic Masses celebrated every day on planet Earth. The Church has recognized over one hundred eucharistic miracles, many of which occurred during times of weakened faith in transubstantiation. May the Holy Eucharist continue to nourish our journey on earth to reach heaven. (From CCC)
