Social Justice

National Refugee Week begins today.



The June update from the Australian Catholic Bishop's Office for Social Justice reminds us that perhaps the enduring disquiet in Australian society concerning people arriving seeking security and a decent life reflects a deeper insecurity about the basis of the presence of 'settlers' in this land?

Without a just and proper settlement – a makarrata or treaty – who has the right to say who can or cannot make their lives here?

This reluctance to welcome those most in need certainly reflects a false view of the ownership of land; the truth is that the earth is the common home of the whole human family and of all God's creatures (Pope Francis, Laudato Si', n 66 – 69). Each one of us, and all peoples, belong to God's creation not the other way around.
