Published in 1936 it is considered one of the classics of French literature.

Written in the form of a diary the book follows a young priest in the north of France as he struggles with his indifferent parishioners. A novel about the phenomenology of grace.

## St Maximilian Kolbe



Maximilian was born **Raymund Kolbe** (1894 –1941) and was a Polish Catholic Franciscan priest who volunteered to die in place of a man named Franciszek Gjowniczek in the German death camp of Auschwitz, during World War II. He had been active in promoting the veneration of the Immaculate Virgin Mary, founding and supervising the monastery of Niepokalanów near Warsaw, operating an amateur-radio station (SP3RN), and founding or running several other organizations and publications.

On 10 October 1982, Pope John Paul canonized Kolbe and declared him a martyr of charity. The Catholic Church venerates him as the patron saint of amateur radio operators, drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalists, and prisoners. John Paul II declared him "the patron of our difficult century". His feast day is 14 August, the day of his martyrdom.

St Maximilian's life was strongly influenced in 1906, when he was 12, by a vision of the Virgin Mary. He later described this incident:

"That night I asked the Mother of God what was to become of me. Then she came to me holding two crowns, one white, the other red. She asked me if I was willing to accept either of these crowns. The white one meant that I should persevere in purity and the red that I should become a martyr. I said that I would accept them both."
