

Book Club

Our next book club meeting will be discussing Richard Rohr's book **The Divine Dance**. The adjective triune ,as in a triune God, trips off the tongue so easily, but centuries of pondering on the mystery of the Trinity must give us pause. Three into one, and persons not substance has us all reaching for metaphors in defending our beliefs, let alone the iota of difference between homoousios and homoiousios. After centuries of councils and debates, there are still ways of reflecting on the Trinity that are new.

The book for February is Sheldon Vanauken's **A Severe Mercy** - A Story of Faith, Tragedy, and Triumph.


