## Parish Collections

appeal.

## Bookclub

At the Wednesday General Audience on September 5, 1979, Saint Pope John Paul II delivered the first of 129 catechesis on human love in the divine plan. Considered his masterpiece, the text outlines what has been described as reflections on the theology of the body or alternatively, the redemption of the body and the sacramentality of marriage. Christopher West has devoted his life's work to defending this text. We will be discussing Christopher West's **Theology of the Body for Beginners** at our next book club meeting Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September at 1600 hrs in the parish offices.

In October we will be reading another of Saint Pope John Paul's works- **Crossing the Threshold of Hope**.

In November we will end the year of reading with a session of sharing something that has inspired your faith during the year: a poem. A piece of music perhaps. A painting. Whatever. In previous years this session has been most enjoyable.

In January we will read Richard Rohr's **The Divine Dance**, a meditation on the Trinity.

The book for February is Sheldon Vanauken's **A Severe Mercy- A Story of Faith, Tragedy, and Triumph**.

In March we will read Julian of Norwich's work **Revelations of Divine Love**.

## St Vincent de Paul

Feast: Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> September

In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus Christ instructs his Apostles to care for those who are hungry, thirsty, sick, in prison and poor.

In those who are oppressed or struggling, Jesus identifies himself. "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me,"

Saint Vincent de Paul took this instruction to heart throughout his life, so much so, he is the patron of all works of charity.

As a young priest, he was kidnapped and auctioned off as a slave, spending two years in bondage. This, along with other experiences with the poor, led to a change of heart in Saint Vincent, who had originally envisioned a life of leisure as a priest.

Instead, he dedicated his priestly ministry to serving the neglected and the poor, those in small villages and other areas which were largely abandoned by the rest of society.

He helped to found the Congregation of the Mission, known as the Vincentians, to bring the Good News to the poor and minister to them. He also founded the Company of the Daughters of Charity, a group of women who served the poorest of the poor.

So strong was his influence and example, that the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul was named after him two centuries after his death. Known in Australia as "Vinnies", this society continues the great work of Saint Vincent in more than 150 countries across the globe, serving the poor and witnessing to the intrinsic dignity of every single person.

Thank you to all our St Vinnies men and women who assist those in need, especially our Terrigal Conference.

This Saturday morning at 9am Mass there will be a blessing of the members of the St Vincent de Paul in our Parish.

## Voluntary Assisted Dying

Voluntary Assisted Dying (euthanasia) became legal in NSW in November 2023. This means eligible people in our state are able to request medical assistance to end their life.

Catholic teaching says that assisted suicide is a completely unacceptable solution to the problem of suffering and a genuinely human society does not eliminate those who suffer but cares for them.

Advocates for VAD insist they are the compassionate ones, while VAD opponents insist it is not "compassionate" to inject someone with lethal drugs, and that doctor-assisted suicide puts the medical profession, who have a duty to care for the ill, elderly and vulnerable, in an impossible situation.

The church's position on VAD flows from our understanding of the human person. VAD contradicts the goodness and dignity of each human person, created in the image of God – a unique, irreplaceable individual.
