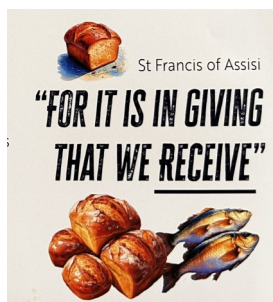

What were the actual charges. What provoked them?

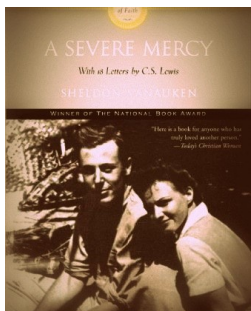
How did it bounce between Herod, the Jews and Pilate?

## Book Club



Bookclub for February will be discussing A Severe Mercy by Sheldon Vanauken. According to the blurb on the back it was the winner of the National Book Award. A memoir which traces the love story between Sheldon and Jean Vanauken. While studying at Oxford, the two converted to Christianity after a transformative friendship with C S Lewis. This change shook the foundation of their relationship, leading Sheldon to realise that he was no longer Jean's primary love-God was. The book includes letters written by Lewis and negotiates a narrative arc from head to heart. As Christianity today has noted- a book for anyone who has truly loved another person. The book is the spiritual autobiography of a love rather than lovers.

In March we will be reflecting on the divine revelations experienced by the fourteenth century mystic, Julian of Norwich as published in Revelations of Divine Love. "An extraordinary work of medieval mysticism, from one of the first known woman authors writing in English.

In April we will be reading "A Rabbi Talks With Jesus" by Jacob Neusner.

In May we will reflect on David Bentley Hart's argument "That all Shall be Saved", a book about Heaven Hell and Universal salvation.

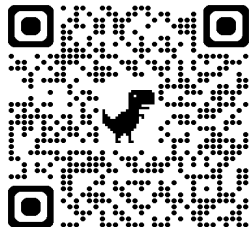

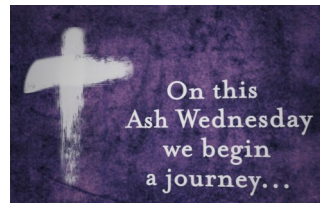

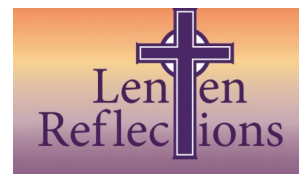
