Advent Praparation

Thursday at 7pm in the Parish Office starting <u>this</u> Thursday 28 November.

Behold a virgin shall conceive and shall bear a son.....(Isaiah 7:14)

These words from the prophet Isaiah set the scene for the coming of Christ over 2000 years later. This year in the Advent study program we will be examining the story of the birth of our Saviour and of the scriptures written about it. We will ask and hopefully answer many questions.

Why did Joseph go to Bethlehem? Why is Joseph's genealogy set out in Matthew and in Luke but not in Mark and John?

Why are the two genealogies different? Why do the accounts of the birth of Christ in Matthew and Luke differ?

What did the early Christians believe about the birth of Christ? What did St Paul believe? Why is there no mention of the birth in his many epistles? The story is fascinating. It is indeed the greatest story ever told.

We relive it each year as the climax of the year -but this is the climax God's revelation to man?

What were the Old Testament prophecies? How does the birth of Christ fulfil them?

Why do we ask? Because that is the way we deepen our knowledge and through deepening our knowledge we deepen our faith.

And in developing our faith we are reminded of the words of Christ —"" for you shall learn the truth and the truth will make you free."" (John 8:32).

The helpless baby born in a cradle in the stables has a message for us. It is not just a lovely story – it is a true love story. All welcome to come along. Bibles and prayer books will be supplied. Lets prepare our hearts for HIS coming to us this Christmas

The Sacrament of Penance



Last week I explained that the Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation or Confession) has four essential elements: confession of sins, act of contrition, penance, and prayer of absolution. FORGIVEN And depending on whether these elements are celebrated individually or communally, we have three forms for celebrating

the sacrament.

In the first form everything is celebrated individually between the priest and the penitent. This is what we are most familiar with and how we celebrate in the parish each Saturday morning. What we have celebrated as the "second rite" is a communal penitential liturgy followed by the first form.

The second form of the sacrament is a communal celebration: there is individual confession of sins and absolution: however the act of contrition and the penance are done together by all those present. This second form of the sacrament will be celebrated at 7pm each Friday during Advent. We will have a brief penitential liturgy involving a prayer, reading and examination of conscience; then each person will come to the priest and say: "I am sorry for ... " and the priest will pray the prayer of absolution: "I absolve you ... "; then we will say our penance together. Unless we have large numbers attending, there will only be one priest.

The third form of the sacrament when all four elements are celebrated communally can only be used in the case of an emergency.

Synod on Synodality

The final document from the Synod on Synodality has been released. On a positive side, this document reinforces the methodology of synodality as the new way for the Church to foster collaborative decision making. It emphasises the importance of Catholics claiming their 'baptismal rights' to participate on an equal basis with the clergy. But some people were disappointed that the Synod reaffirmed episcopal authority that can act as a veto on any matter within a bishop's jurisdiction.

'He loved us', Saint Paul says of Christ (cf. *Rom* 8:37), in order to make us realize that nothing can ever "separate us" from that love (Rom 8:39)": Thus begins Pope Francis' fourth Encyclical, which takes its title from the opening words, Dilexit nos.

The Encyclical is dedicated to the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus Christ: "His open heart has gone before us and waits for us, unconditionally, asking only to offer us His love and friendship," the Pope writes in the introductory paragraph. "For 'He loved us first' (cf. 1 Jn 4:10). Because of Jesus, 'we have come to know and believe in the love that God has for us' (1 Jn 4:16)." Read the full text here.


