Plenary Council

The National Centre for pastoral research has now completed the statistical analysis of all Plenary Council submissions Australia wide.

It reports a total of 222,000 people participated either through individual submissions or by group response. Terrigal, as stated already, held its own. 187 submissions, 86 at the parish gathering and 101 in email, card or letter.

The 2016 census showed 5,291,000 Australian Catholics. (22.6% of the population.)

The most recent analysis of Church attendance estimates 14%, (740,000,) attend Mass regularly. One third of regular mass attendees have participated. This is far more than was originally anticipated and is a great success.

It illustrates the desire of Australian Catholics for renewal and reform.

The Australian experience is being watched overseas. The last plenary council in the United States was in 1884. In 2002 American bishops proposed holding one but it has never eventuated.

Ireland last held a plenary council in 1875.! Tragically, these dates simply illustrate the tight hold held by the bishops over the church in Ireland and in Australia and the United States where the church history and

structure largely reflects the Irish experience.

Austen Invereigh, has come to Australia to observe the preparations for the council. He is well known as the principal biographer of Pope Francis and as the author of a number of studies of the church. His latest work is entitled: "how to defend the faith without raising your voice. " -quite appropriate for modern times! He writes how impressed he is by the momentum building up for the council which he describes as "mechanism towards renewal."

The council needs to be seen as part of the renewal of the church. This is taking place at every level. For example, the recent Synod in Rome of senior bishops to discuss clerical sexual abuse has resulted in the newly announced changes to canon law requiring the immediate disclosure of clerical abusers to the police.

Catholic Outlook further reports that there is to be a review of the responsibilities of bishops. The Pope writes:

"The way we locate ourselves in history has changed. Things we thought would never happen or that we thought we would never see we are experiencing now, and we dare not even imagine the future."

We await with interest the principal summary of submissions to be released at Pentecost 2019.
