

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

We are considering homeschooling our children. Does this present a problem when it is time for them to receive the sacraments? What must we do?

Answer:

Homeschooling is legal in all states and like other types of education, has its advantages and its drawbacks. There are many factors to consider, and each family has to decide what the best way to educate its children is. With religious education, many dioceses have a formal policy that outlines procedures and expectations, some of which include more than just academic information. Call the religious education office to find out what they are for your area.

In general, though, an appointment with your parish priest to discuss your situation is the best first step. An opportunity to discuss what is available, what the expectations are for each sacrament, and how you can best prepare your child helps make your time of preparation more effective. The priest can direct you to good catechetical materials, parent information classes, and other choices and possibilities for your child. All parents need to be part of their child's religious education, taking a lead in instilling the values and beliefs of their faith.

Communication and information helps us all to teach and preach the Gospel as Jesus did.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

No matter what the season or time of year, whenever I read the Gospel of Jesus calming the storm, I remember the Christmas blizzard of 1983. It was snowing lightly when we left Ohio for Chicago, but by the time we reached Indiana the flurries had turned into a freezing whiteout. We were somewhere on Interstate 65 when the van began to sputter and stall. Every story I heard of people freezing to death came back to me.

We eased into the emergency lane and discovered there was an exit only a mile ahead. We prayed our way to the gas station that was actually open on Christmas Eve. We waited at the diner next door and learned that the state police had just closed the Interstate at the next exit. We quickly reserved a room at the closest motel. When the car was fixed, we took off again in the storm.

Once settled in our room, Roger and I headed for the lobby to get news of the storm. Everything we heard was disheartening: Roads were closed until the next day, and there was little food in the small, attached restaurant. In surprisingly good spirits, the folks who were gathered began sharing the edibles they had with them. Oranges, cheese, bread and other holiday goodies were quickly divided up.

Back in our room, we ate our food next to a crayoned Christmas tree the children had drawn and decorated while we were gone. Before we went to sleep, Roger read the Christmas story from the Gideon Bible and we broke and shared the last piece of bread. By the next afternoon the roads were open and we could leave for my dad's.

I can empathize with the apostles as they feared for their lives in the tempest. I can also proclaim the wonder of Jesus knowing that there is more than one way he can calm a storm.

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

Judging is a topic in the readings this week. It is something we all do whether we admit it or not. At a Midwestern parish there was a woman who was in charge of the St. Vincent DePaul chapter and did all the intake of clients who needed assistance. She frequently spoke with the parish staff about clients after they had left the building. She didn't hesitate to express her strong opinions about why this or that person had fallen into poverty. The staff and the pastor suggested that she not be so quick to judge, but to no avail. She really thought she knew people and that it was her right to have and express her opinions. One day, a pregnant woman with three small children came to the office for help. Jeanne remarked to the woman that she obviously couldn't afford the children she had so why another one? The woman bowed her head for a minute and then lifted it and said, "This is my first one actually. The three with me are my sister's children. She and her husband died in a car accident two months ago. We were blessed to be given custody of the children. Of course we weren't prepared for this and I had to quit work to care for them, and we are temporarily in a bind."

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

As we head into winter, many begin considering winter vacations and travel. Although it's tempting to hop on an airplane to get someplace more quickly, consider putting a big dent in your carbon footprint by driving instead of flying, choosing a nearer location for vacationing, or even doing a "stay-cation." Without being judgmental of others who still fly, share why you are making these choices to start creating some "positive peer pressure."

They have been operating since 1977. They provide a safe space where people can be connected to specialist caseworkers who can assist across 4 main areas: Housing and Homelessness, Domestic and Family Violence, Multicultural Services, Family and Youth. They also provide one of the only drop in centres where people can find help without making an appointment and in a judgment-free space. They also provide material aid and food to anyone in need. Last year they saw 7860 people accessing our Community Drop in service, and 3115 occasions of support (including Homelessness, Domestic and Family Violence and Multicultural Services). 



If your friend is afraid, ask God to make the fear go away.


