

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

Answer:

Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored. **©LPi**

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

There is a classic scene in the stage version of Peter Pan when the sparkling light that is Tinker Bell begins to dim. Peter looks out at the audience and tells them that Tinker Bell's light will go out forever if they can't convince her that they believe in her. Peter encourages the audience to clap as hard as they can to convince the little fairy of their belief. As the noise from the clapping grows louder and louder, the sparkle that is Tinker Bell grows brighter and brighter.

Wouldn't it be great if we could have our children just clap their hands to show they believe in Jesus? And wouldn't it be even greater if their clapping made Jesus' presence as real as Tinker Bell's light? Actually, making all of that happen isn't a whole lot more difficult.

Teach your children they can show they believe in Jesus by making their own little light shine. Help them to find different ways of making other people's lives brighter. Let them help you bake some favourite cookies for Grandma or cook a special surprise meal for Mom or Dad. Talk to them about how Jesus loved and took care of people. Help them to see the little light within them as Jesus' light.

If you want your child to believe in Jesus there are two things you can do. First, let him hear you talk about what Jesus means to you. Second, show her that you believe in Jesus by your actions. Let your child see the light burning brightly in your heart. Like the applause that convinced Tinker Bell that the audience believed she was real, your

words and actions will prove to your child that Jesus is a reality in your life.


FAMILY RESPONSE:

If your children know the song, "This Little Light of Mine," sing it together. Ask them what they think the little light is. Tell them that their Jesus-light shines brighter with every good thing they do. Talk about what they did last week and what they can do in the week coming up to make that light shine.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

Your little light shines whenever you take time to talk about God/Jesus or your faith with your child. How do you feel about the family time you are taking each week as you reflect on the Scriptures?

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WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

One of Blessed Pope Paul the VI's most famous quotes is, "If you want peace, work for justice." This idea comes from years of Catholic social teaching responding to the world and the issues at hand in any given age. This statement can be clearly understood today. Just take a look at the countries in crisis. At the heart of the refugee crisis is a lack of justice from a government that has amassed wealth while the people go hungry or without opportunities for education and participation in decisions that affect them. Followers of Jesus Christ must work to alleviate issues that attack the dignity of the human person – with works of charity and acts of justice. What exactly does that mean? When refugees are hungry and homeless, we must feed them and help them get the safe homes they deserve. Those would be acts of charity. Policy and political change are both ways to bring justice. Both are needed to make change happen. Your challenge is to choose an injustice you see in your community. Ask questions about the issue. What do I know about this injustice and what don't I know? Who is affected by the issue? Who has the power to change the issue? Who seeks to gain if the issue isn't resolved? Now… what are YOU going to do about

the issue? Start today.
