WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why are some saints honoured as "patron saints"?

Answer:

Each person is unique and each of us has different gifts, interests, talents, and, yes, even struggles and areas where we need to grow. This is no less true of those holy women, men, and children who have been canonized or beatified.

Because we believe that the saints and blesseds are both models of faith and intercessors, Christians have looked to certain holy people as role models and heavenly protectors for occupations, spiritual charisms, and even places. Although the Church sometimes names a person as a patron saint (e.g. Saint Philip Neri as the patron of Rome, Saint Clare of Assisi as the patroness of television, or Saint Aloysius Gonzaga as the patron of youth and young adults), more often it is popular devotion that inspires lay Christians to turn to a particular saint or blessed for heavenly help and support. This is how, for example, Saint Cecilia came to be honoured as the patroness of musicians, Saint Toribio Romo as patron of migrants coming into the United States, and Saint Gertrude of Nivelles as patroness of cat lovers. Although there are official and unofficial lists of patron saints, we should always feel free to ask any and all the saints to give us their patronage and protection in whatever it is that we need. BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Jesus makes it pretty clear he does not like hypocrites. In this Gospel, he is referring to the Pharisees who are more impressed with outward appearances than inner character. We have a wise saying concerning the same thing, "Don't judge a book by its cover." In the case of the Pharisees, the cover looked fine; it was the inside that was corrupt. I recall hoping the faculty would remember that saying with its proper meaning as I watched my son leave for school one Monday, following spring break.

Peter was wearing knee-length shorts and sneakers with one grey sock and one red. When I pointed the fact out to him, he replied that wearing socks of different colours was his thing. Apparently, he'd been doing it all year. I hadn't noticed because, up until now, he'd been wearing long pants. I didn't say another word. Peter is the youngest of my five; I'd already learned to pick my battles.

I knew that when a child becomes an adolescent, I had to let some things go, saving my energy for the really important issues. I knew Pete was a good kid. He was respectful, kind and generous. If people were going to judge my son on his outward appearance, it was their problem.

I try to remember how I felt that spring whenever I see a teenager with pants hanging below his boxers or hair dyed a bright orange. "Don't judge," I tell myself, "he's probably a great kid with wonderful parents." And I think about Peter today, a junior high teacher in a Catholic school who wears a shirt and tie every day and socks of the same colour.


FAMILY RESPONSE:

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

The Catholic Church upholds the dignity of work and the rights of workers. One of those rights is to a just wage, one which provides adequate income to support oneself and one's family. This week's challenge is to advocate for a just wage for all people, no matter what

their occupation. As a household, find out what the minimum wage is in your state. Discuss what you would have to give up if your family had to live on the minimum wage. Then decide on one step you can take, such as emailing your state legislators, to support a more livable minimum wage in your state.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

"This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." –Mark 7:6.

How often do we lament the destruction of our planet, but still choose to do activities or buy products that harm the environment? Jesus reminds us that is important to both "talk the talk" *AND* "walk the walk." How can you challenge yourself to make your actions align

with your values around caring for the environment? Can you choose to bike instead of drive? Can you give up plastic water bottles? Can you buy locally grown food rather than produce flown in from hundreds or even thousands of miles away?
