

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is the difference between mortal and venial sin?

Answer:

Sin is a deliberate thought, word, action, or omission contrary to God's law. Since the beginnings of the Church, sin has been distinguished by its gravity. "Grave matter" is traditionally defined by the Ten Commandments. If a person commits a grave sin with full knowledge of the action's evil and with the complete consent of their will, this is a mortal sin. The effects of mortal sin are grave the loss of sanctifying grace, which can be restored by a fresh outpouring of God's mercy in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Venial sin does not fit one or more of these conditions (for example, a less serious matter still freely chosen or grave matter committed while under force or ignorance of God's law). The effects of venial sin – while still damaging to the human heart and human society – are less severe. Even so, smaller sins build habits, which can obstruct our growth in virtue. When we are serious about following Jesus, we should do our best to avoid all sin, whether large or small! ©LPi

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

These verses can sound a bit threatening: "repent or perish." In fact, they come in the middle of several chapters in which Jesus is communicating a great urgency for his listeners to take action and begin doing the work of building the Kingdom of God. Several parables before and after today's reading have the same theme. "You know what to do. I'm giving you a heads-up, so don't wait. You never know how much time you have left to live so get started now before it's too late."

What is it Jesus wants us to do before we die? He has spent the first half of Luke's Gospel telling us: feed the hungry, heal the sick, welcome the outcast and the stranger, love your neighbour as yourself, pray for what you need, celebrate goodness and beauty, etc. It's so easy for us to be lulled into thinking we'll always have more time, but anyone who has ever lost a loved one knows we are never promised tomorrow. God asks us to bear fruit now. Hug your children *today* when they go off to school and before they go to sleep (even if you're frustrated with them!). Circle back to the difficult conversation with your partner that needs to be resolved rather than stewing about it for another day. Call your estranged relative, neighbour or friend today lest neither of you be around tomorrow to make amends then. Slow down and listen to the child or the lonely person who is desperate for your time and attention today rather than be productive in one more thing you won't care about if you were to die tomorrow.

Jesus knows we can't do everything we want to do in our limited waking hours. He also knows that just as trees need water, manure, and pruning to bear good fruit, we need our own versions of nourishment to keep doing good work. He's not asking us to

bring about God's kingdom by ourselves. He's just urging us to do what is ours now rather than discover in the future that we've missed our chance.

FAMILY RESPONSE:

Brainstorm and decide together something you can do that shows you are bearing good fruit as a family.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

Is there something that feels important that has been nagging at you that you feel God wants you to do? Make a plan to do it today.

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


As we enter more deeply into Lent, we recall Jesus washing the feet of his apostles. This action contains two essential challenges for those who seek justice in the world: the challenge to serve and the challenge to be

served. Jesus sets the example to serve in ways that may seem to be beneath us and calls Peter to accept service. Many great leaders, even in the corporate world, spend some of their time doing the work of the lowest paid person in the organization as an important reminder that all work is valuable. This act is also a beautiful sign that the service of these all-too-often forgotten people is well-received by the leader. Step out of your comfort zone this week and do a task that may seem to be beneath you. Experience the dignity in your simple service.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

During Lent the readings are full of desert imagery, especially the Old Testament readings which tell the story of the Israelites wandering in the desert for 40 long years, sometimes on the brink of death from lack of food and water. As Pope Benedict preached, "The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast." Pope Francis' proposed solution for this is an interior conversion whereby our faith in Jesus is demonstrated by our relationship with the natural world. This week consider whether others can recognize



in you a faith that moves you to action on behalf of the environment.
