

### Pope Francis invites the faithful to pray the Rosary in October



**Pope Francis' invitation** 

The Holy Father has decided to invite all the faithful, of all the world, to pray the Holy Rosary every day, during the entire Marian month of October, and thus to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other.

The Holy Father met with Fr. Fréderic Fornos, S.J., international director of the World Network of Prayer for the Pope, and asked him to spread this appeal to all the faithful throughout the world, inviting them to conclude the recitation of the Rosary with the ancient invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium", and with the prayer to Saint Michael Archangel that he protect us and help us in the struggle against evil (cf. Revelation 12, 7-12).

The prayer – the Pontiff affirmed a few days ago, on 11 September, in a homily at Santa Marta, citing the first book of Job – is the weapon against the Great Accuser who "goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat him. The Russian mystics and the great saints of all the traditions advised, in moments of spiritual turbulence, to shelter beneath the mantle of the Holy Mother of God pronouncing the invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium".

### **Sub Tuum Praesidium**

The invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium" is recited as follows: "Sub tuum praesidium confugimus Sancta Dei Genitrix. Nostras deprecationes ne despicias in necessitatibus, sed a periculis cunctis libera nos semper, Virgo Gloriosa et Benedicta".

[We fly to thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin].

With this request for intercession the Holy Father asks the faithful of all the world to pray that the Holy Mother of God place the Church beneath her protective mantle: to preserve her from the attacks by the devil, the great accuser, and at the same time to make her more aware of the faults, the errors and the abuses committed in the present and in the past, and committed to combating without any hesitation, so that evil may not prevail.

### **Prayer to Saint Michael**

The Holy Father has also asked that the recitation of the Holy Rosary during the month of October conclude with the prayer written by Leo XIII:

"Sancte Michael Archangele, defende nos in proelio; contra nequitiam et insidias diaboli esto praesidium. Imperet illi Deus, supplices deprecamur: tuque, Princeps militiae caelestis, Satanam aliosque spiritus malignos, qui ad perditionem animarum pervagantur in mundo, divina virtute, in infernum detrude. Amen".


[Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen1.

The Rosary is a synthesis of the mysteries of Christ: we contemplate them with Mary, who allows us to see with her eyes of faith and love.

### Pope Francis Reflects on the Rosary.

Here I would like to emphasise the beauty of a simple contemplative prayer, accessible to all, great and small, the educated and those with little education. It is the prayer of the Holy Rosary. In the Rosary we turn to the Virgin Mary so that she may guide us to an ever closer union with her Son Jesus to bring us into conformity with him, to have his sentiments and to behave like him. Indeed, in the Rosary while we repeat the Hail Mary we meditate on the Mysteries, on the events of Christ's life, so as to know and love him ever better. The Rosary is an effective means for opening ourselves to God, for it helps us to overcome egotism and to bring peace to hearts, in the family, in society and in the world.

### **HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY**

- 1 While holding the crucifix make the Sign of the Cross. and then pray the Apostles Creed.
- 2 Pray the Our Father on the first large bead.
- 3 Pray a Hail Mary for an increase of faith, hope and charity on each of the three small beads.
- 4 Pray the Glory Be to the Father before on the next large bead.
- 5 Recall the first Rosary Mystery and pray the Our Father on the large bead.
- 6 On each of the adjacent ten small beads (also refered to as a decade) pray a Hail Mary while reflecting on the mystery.
- 7 On the next large bead, pray the Glory Be to the Father, the Fatima prayer... 0 my Jesus...
- 8 Each succeeding decade is prayed in a similar manner by recalling the appropriate mystery, praying the Our Father, ten Hail Marys while reflecting on the mystery, the Glory Be to the Father, and the Fatima prayer.
- 9 When the fifth mystery is completed, the Rosary is Customarily concluded with the Hail Holy Queen, and the Sign of the Cross.



### **Sign Of The Cross**

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

### **The Apostles Creed**

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit. born of the Virgin Mary, He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; he ascended into Heaven sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting, Amen.

#### **Our Father**

Our Father, who art in Heaven; hallowed by Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. Amen

### **Hail Mary**

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of death. Amen

#### **Glory Be**

Glory be to the Father, to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end, Amen.

### 0 My Jesus

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of your Mercy. Amen.

### Hail, Holy Queen

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope.

To thee we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. - 3. The Nativity (Poverty) Luke 2:1-20

  The Virgin Mary gives birth to the Redeemer of the World.
- 4. The Presentation (Obedience) Luke 2:22-39

  The Blessed Mother presents the Child Jesus
  in the Temple
- 5. Finding in the Temple (Piety) Luke 2:42-52

  The Blessed Mother finds Jesus in the
  Temple.

### The Luminous Mysteries

- 1. The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan John 1:29-34 The heavens open wide and the voice of the Father declares Jesus the beloved Son
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana John 2:1-11 The first of the signs, when Christ changes water into wine and opens the hearts of the disciples to faith, thanks to the

- intervention of Mary, the first among believers.
- 3. The Announcement of the Kingdom Matthew 4:17
  Jesus proclaims the coming of the Kingdom of God, calls us to conversion and forgives the sins of all who draw near to Him in humble trust.
- 4. The Transfiguration Matthew 17:1-8 The glory of the Godhead shines forth from the face of Christ as the Father commands the astonished Apostles to "listen to him."
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist (food for our salvation) Matthew 26:26-30 Christ offers his body and blood as food under the signs of bread and wine, and testifies "to the end" His love for humanity, for whose salvation He will offer Himself in sacrifice.

### **The Sorrowful Mysteries**

- 1. The Agony in the Garden (Contrition) Luke 22:39-44 At Gethsemane, Jesus prays as He contemplates the sins of the world.
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar (Purity)
  Matthew 27:26
  Jesus is cruelly scourged until His mortified body could bear no more.
- 3. Crowning with Thorns (Courage)
  Matthew 27:28-31
  A crown of thorns is placed on the head of Jesus.
- 4. Carrying of the Cross (Patience) Luke 23:26-32 Jesus carries the heavy cross upon His shoulders to Calvary.
- The Crucifixion (Self-Denial)
   Matthew 27:33-50
   Jesus is nailed to the cross and dies after hours of agony.

### The Glorious Mysteries

- 1. The Resurrection (Faith) Matthew 28:1-20 Jesus rises glorious and immortal, three days after His death.
- 2. The Ascension (Hope) Luke 24:50-51 Jesus ascends into Heaven forty days after His Resurrection.
- 3. Descent of the Holy Spirit (Love) Acts 2:24 The Holy Spirit descends upon Mary and the Apostles.
- 4. The Assumption (Eternal Happiness)
  The Blessed Mother is united with her
  Divine Son in Heaven.
- The Coronation (Devotion to Mary)
   Mary is gloriously crowned Queen of Heaven and earth.

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken heart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on

Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own. We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table. The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God. Furthermore, what Paul taught had first been handed down to him from those who preceded him.




