





## A Mustard Seed Size Faith



#### 1. Supersize it!

We live a "supersize" mentality. Everything has to be big: our food orders at McDonalds, our houses, cars, etc. We need to "supersize" our faith in Jesus. He has the power of doing that for us if we request it with all sincerity and humility. At the same time, we need to exercise the faith we have, especially when the temptation to doubt God increases. Our faith deepens in the measure in which we apply it in all the different circumstances of our life.

#### 2. Believing

As Jesus states, we often want praise or thanks from others because we have done our duty. Yet, we were only doing what we ought to have done. No praise or thanks is needed, since we have done nothing more than what was expected. Rather than look for recognition, praise, or thanks, we should see ourselves as humble servants in search of greater faith everyday.

#### 3. Worthless Slaves ... Us?

No one wants to feel worthless. We all seek to be valued and esteemed, to be needed in some way by others. We strive hard to achieve this esteem from family and friends. However, in our relationship with God our Father, things are often different. We do the minimum in order to get by spiritually. With God's grace we need to strive to go beyond the minimum, giving ourselves with love and without reservation or fear. It is not that God will somehow value us more; in fact, he already loves us incredibly deeply. Our efforts in the spiritual life are simply a response to God's love. Paradoxically, the more we humbly seek to respond to God's love by doing his will in our lives, the more we experience the greatness of his love.

#### Conversation with Christ:



On October 22, Bishop Anthony will be installing a relic of Saint Pope John Paul II at St. Patrick's Church, East Gosford. At this Mass, St. Patrick's will be established as a Shrine, with a blessing of the associated Pastoral Centre. The Shrine aims to invoke new inspiration for evangelisation, offering pilgrims a form of devotion that is not common in the Australian context. Those who attend the Mass are eligible to receive a partial indulgence, and the Shrine will be open during the day for prayer and veneration. A celebration with refreshments will follow. ### **Parishioners**

It's been several months since Bishop Bernard O'Grady moved from the presbyteryin Avalon, leaving it vacant. During this time, the Parish Finance Committee have been discerning as to what to do with the unoccupied residence.

Through their consultation with various groups, they have realised the importance of maintaining the residence as a place for the clergy/religious whilstalso understanding the need for an income stream for the Parish to ensure its viability.

The members of the parish finance committee have created and designed some proposed changes to the internal layout of the residence (without needing to make any changes or amendments to the outside of the building) which they are confident will achieve both of these needs.

These changes to the internal layout will allow for two uses of the building. Firstly, the change will accommodate for up to 2 clergy/religious to use the space for retreats, sabbaticals or holidays. Secondly, the change will create a living space that can be leased to a couple or a small family.

If you have any concerns in regard to these proposed changes to the layout please do not hesitate to contact Fr Richard or attend a brief consultation meeting following the 9:00am Mass on Sunday 2 October in the Avalon hall.



## REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken heart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on.

Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own.

We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table. The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God. Furthermore, what Paul taught had first been handed down to him from those who preceded him.
