Each day in November, a Mass will be offered for all the names published in our "Book of Remembrance."







Parish Bulletin - Term 4, Week 3

Students involved with Zonta have assembled over 300 birthing kits this week for the Birthing Kit Foundation Australia. These kits, along with essential educational resources, will be sent to remote regions in developing countries to promote hygienic birthing practices, helping mothers safely welcome their newborns into the world.

Year 9 students participated in the annual Spirituality Day with the Youth Mission Team at Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School. The experience encouraged teamwork and personal development, fostering leadership skills in a supportive environment.

Meanwhile, Year 12 students continue their HSC examinations, while Year 10 students began their exams this week, which will run into next week. The College community is encouraged to keep these students in their thoughts and prayers during this demanding period. Cyber safety was a major focus at the College this week, with workshops held for students to promote awareness and safe online habits. An evening Parent Information Session followed, reinforcing the importance of vigilance in the digital space.

On Sunday, students and staff took part in Youth Landcare Day at St Anthony in the Fields Parish. The initiative, aimed at preserving the local ecosystem, involved caring for wildlife and maintaining the natural environment at the Kierans Creek Landcare Group site.

Soul Mass will take place this Sunday at 6:00pm at Sacred Heart Parish Mona Vale. All students, staff and their families are warmly invited to attend the Eucharistic celebration, followed by a shared meal for everyone.

In sports, students continue to shine across various competitions, including the Chloe Dalton Girls Rugby 7's, MWBA Basketball and the Cricket Downie Cup.




and Pastoral Care

Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

REFLECTION by Diane Bergant


Israel was called by God. To what was Israel called? To what were the crowds who followed Jesus called? To what are we called? To a covenant relationship with the Lord who is God, the one who is Lord alone. We have been invited into an intimate personal relationship with the creator of the universe, the one who plays with black holes and white dwarfs

and at the same time with infinite interest has numbered the very hairs on our head (cf. Matt 10:30). We have heard this so often that it may have become commonplace. The marvel of it may escape our attention, because it has become just a part of our religious language. It is well that once in a while we are shaken to our senses, 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord is your God, the Lord alone!'

It is not marvel enough that this mysterious God has created us; we have also been redeemed. As victim-priest Jesus has offered himself on our behalf. He is the sacrifice that sealed the covenant; his blood was the expiation for our sins; he is our rock, our fortress, our deliverer, our shield, our stronghold. Only one thing is asked of us in return: that we open ourselves to him and cling to the covenant, that we proclaim with all our hearts 'The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!' We are to love with all our heart and all our soul and all our strength; we are to love God and to love others


